INTRODUCTION

This summary of material was compiled by the Office of Institutional Research and Planning with the assistance and input of various other offices, especially the Registrar's Office. The purpose of this document is to serve as a ready reference which provides a point-in-time picture of Texas Christian University.

The data included in this document are organized into four major areas: Student Data, Academic Program Data, Faculty and Staff Data, and Resource Data. Data based on the Fall 1983 statistics have been combined and supplemented with historical data in each area. While most summaries are based on Fall statistics, some are based on the Fiscal Year Ended May 31, 1983.

Sources of data are included at the conclusion of each section. Unusual or confusing terms are defined in the foreword of the document. The graphics package has been expanded to include a visual interpretation of most of the data elements.

DEFINITIONS

Credit Hours -

Original - based on original registration before any hours are dropped and/or added.

100% Refund - based on hours dropped and/or added as of the date of 100% tuition refund.

Eligible for Tenure - Full time faculty members who are in permanent, tenure-track positions on the TCU Budget.

F.T.E. Formulas - See attached page.

Full Time Equivalent - The number obtained when part time students, faculty or staff are converted to full time using a variety of formulas.

Instructional Faculty - Faculty members who devote at least 50% of their time to classroom instruction.

Maximum Capacity - The number of available beds on campus. It includes those rooms originally built as doubles designated as triples because of large enough square footage. It does not include doubles assigned temporarily as triples.

Non-Academic Support Personnel - Full time and part time personnel at TCU who carry job codes in the 1000, 3000, 4000, 5000, 6000 and 7000 series.

Official Headcount Enrollment - Student enrollment becomes official on the last day of late registration.

Optimal Capacity - The number of beds available when resident assistants do not have roommates and when all rooms originally built as doubles are assigned as double rooms rather than triples.

Optimal Capacity in Greek Houses - The maximum capacity in fraternities and sororities is equal to the optimal occupancy.

Self-Reported Data - Information the students report about themselves. This includes classification, ethnicity, major, place of residence (geographic), religion and sex.

TCU Corporation - Consists of the AddRan College of Arts and Sciences, the M. J. Neeley School of Business, the School of Education and the School of Fine Arts.

Terminal Degree - Includes all doctoral degrees and some master's degrees where the master's is the terminal degree for a chosen field. An example of this is the M.S.S.W. in Social Work.

University Total - Combines total figures for the TCU Corporation, Brite Divinity School and the Harris College of Nursing.

F.T.E. FORMULAS

F.T.E. Student

1. Southern Association - 12 credit hours = 1.00 F.T.E. student.

Example: $83,537.5 \text{ credit hours} \div 12 = 6,961.46 \text{ F.T.E.}$

2. Texas Coordinating Board - 15 credit hours = 1.00 F.T.E. student.

Example: $83,537.5 \text{ credit hours} \div 15 = 5,569.17 \text{ F.T.E.}$

3. Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS) - Undergraduate students carrying 12 or more hours and graduate or Brite students carrying 9 or more hours are considered full time by HEGIS. Part time hours are converted as follows: Undergraduate credit hours $\div 12$, graduate and Brite Divinity School credit hours $\div 9$. This converted number plus the number of full time students equals the F.T.E. This information is compiled from a special HEGIS printout.

4. TCU Registrar's Office - Students carrying a load of 12 or more semester hours are counted as full time. The loads of part time students are added together and the total is divided by 12. The combined figure is the F.T.E.

F.T.E. Staff

Part time staff are converted to a full time equivalent by dividing the number of hours worked annually by 2,080. For example, a secretary who works 20 hours a week for 52 weeks a year works $1,040 \text{ hours} \div 2,080 = .50 \text{ F.T.E.}$ A secretary who works 40 hours a week for 9 months a year works $1,560 \text{ hours} \div 2,080 = .75 \text{ F.T.E.}$

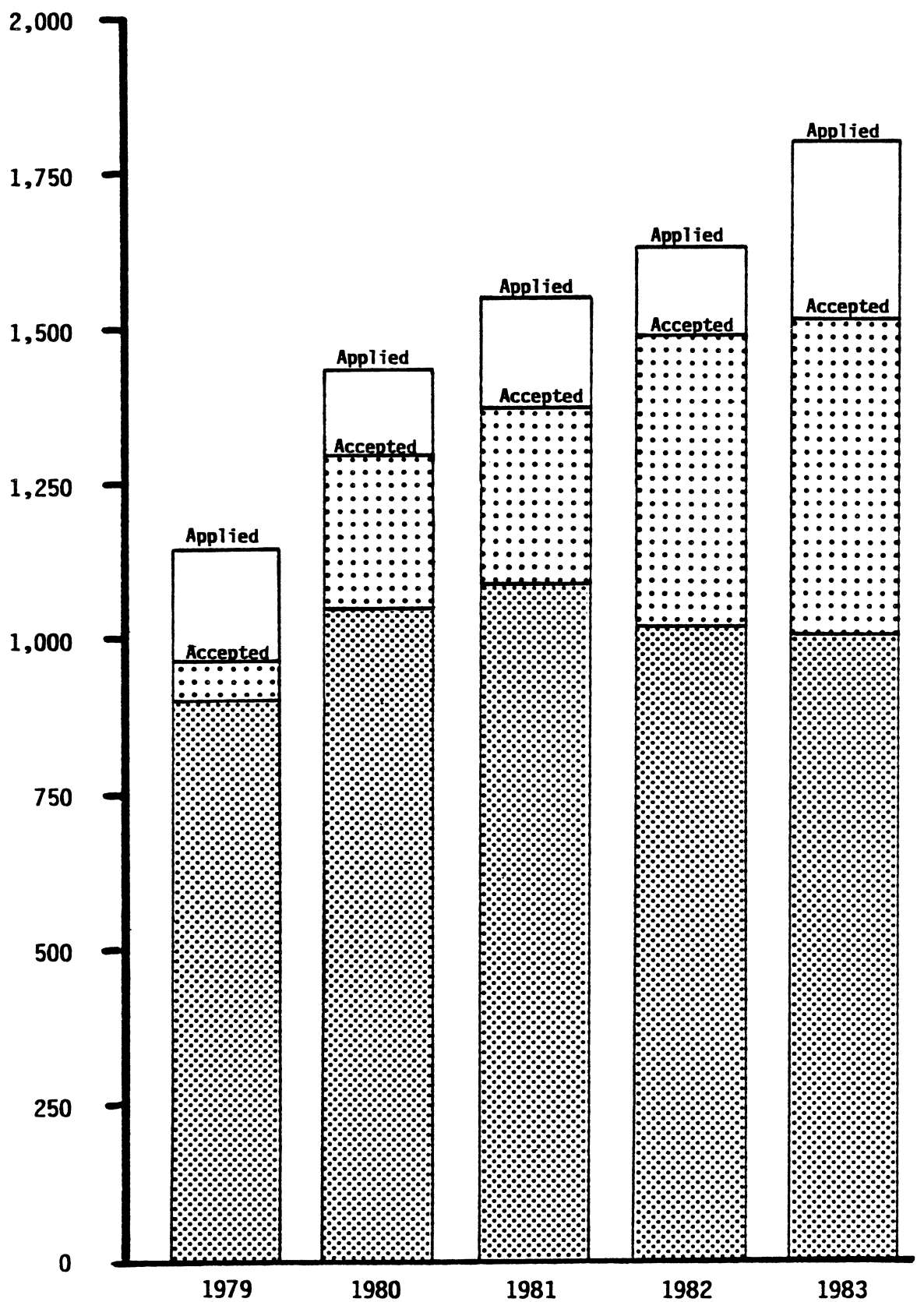
F.T.E. Faculty

Part time faculty F.T.E. was computed as follows: 12 hours = 1.00 F.T.E. faculty except in Performance Music (18 clock hours = 1.00) and P.E. (7 hours = 1.00).

STUDENT DATA HIGHLIGHTS

- The number of freshmen enrolling for Fall 1983 represented a smaller class than last year by 1.4%. For the first time in recent history, TCU closed freshman admissions in August in an effort to increase the quality, rather than the quantity, of the freshman class.
- TCU's rejection rate was the highest (17%) it has been in the past five years. The percentage of freshmen accepted who actually enrolled has declined from 94% in Fall 1979 to 66% in Fall 1983.
- Approximately half (48%) of the 1983 entering class were in the 1st Quartile of their high school graduating class.
- Average SAT scores at TCU increased to 974 compared to a national average of 893. The University average Math SAT exceeded 500.
- For all practical purposes, headcount enrollment remained stable for Fall 1983. However, closer examination indicated a 7.6% increase in graduate enrollment and a 5.2% increase in Brite enrollment with a slight decrease (1.3%) in undergraduate enrollment.
- The percentage of female students in the student body declined, reversing a 10-year trend of an increasing proportion of females.
- Ethnic distribution has changed very little at TCU. However, in relation to five years ago, the Hispanic population showed the greatest positive change. The Asian population showed a marked decrease.
- One-fourth of the 1983 student body at TCU was over 25. While the proportion of older males (26.5%) and females (24.7%) was similar, in relation to the age of the student body five years ago, there has been a significant increase in older women.
- Most TCU students were recruited from the states of Texas, Oklahoma, Kansas, Missouri, Illinois, Florida and California. Few TCU students came from the far west or the deep south.
- Three programs in AddRan had over 200 declared majors: Computer Science, Journalism and Home Economics. The pre-medical program was the fourth largest (161) program in this college.
- The School of Business was the fastest growing component of the University with a growth of 33% in five years. Arts and Sciences increased 23%; Fine Arts, 22%; and Education, 3%. Nursing enrollments have declined 13% since 1979. Graduate majors in Business and Education showed marked increases in relation to Fall 1979.
- While the dormitories at TCU were essentially full (99% of optimal), the cramped conditions of 1982 have been relieved.

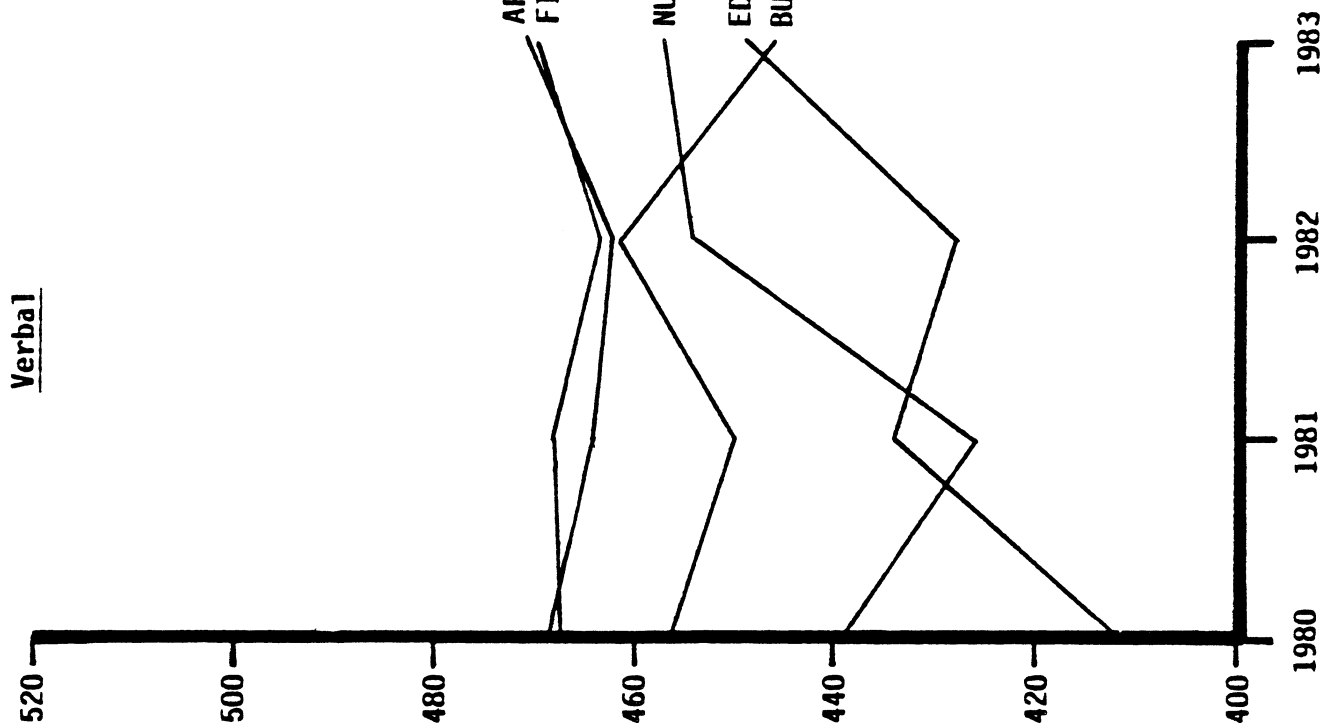

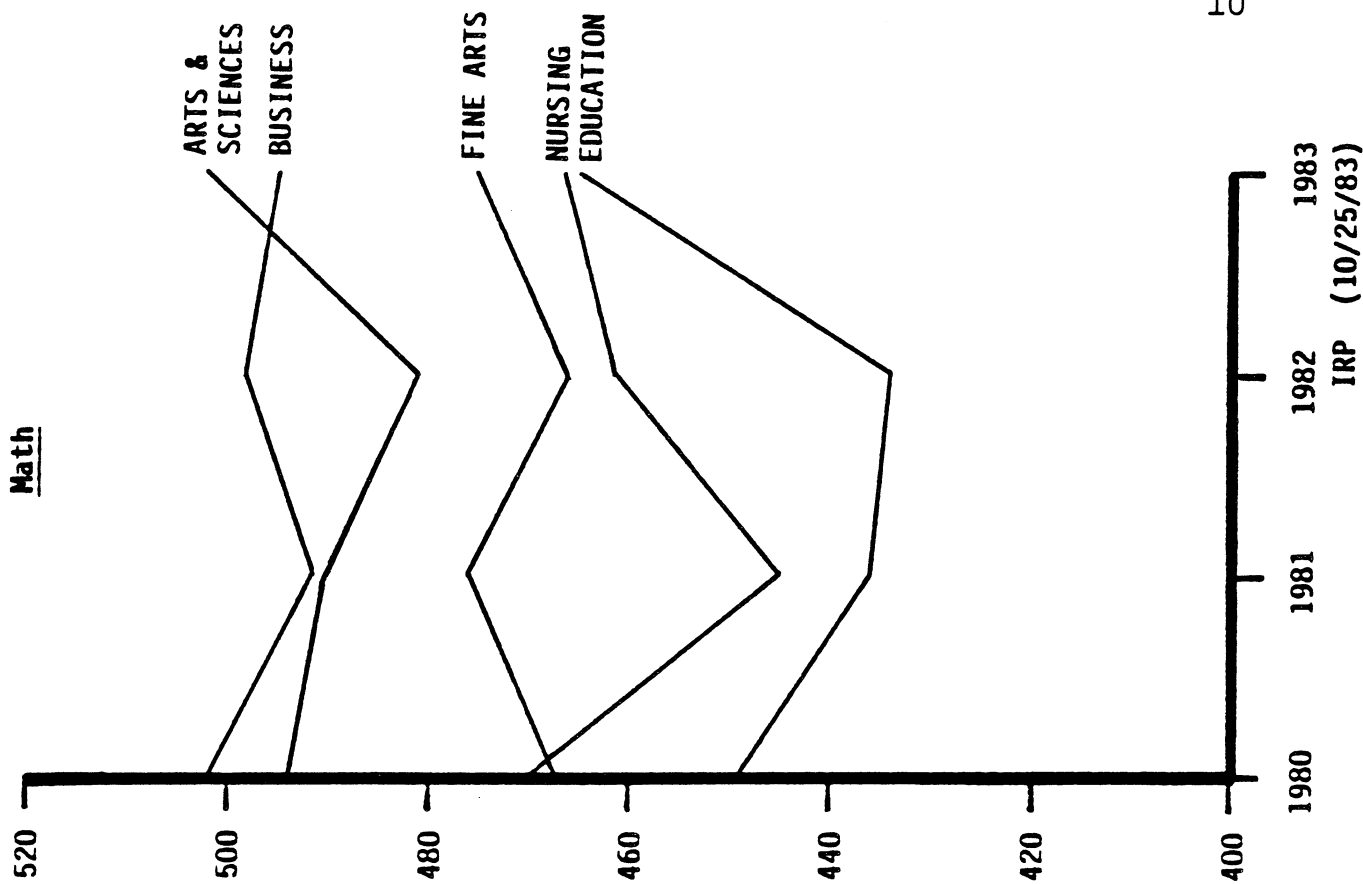

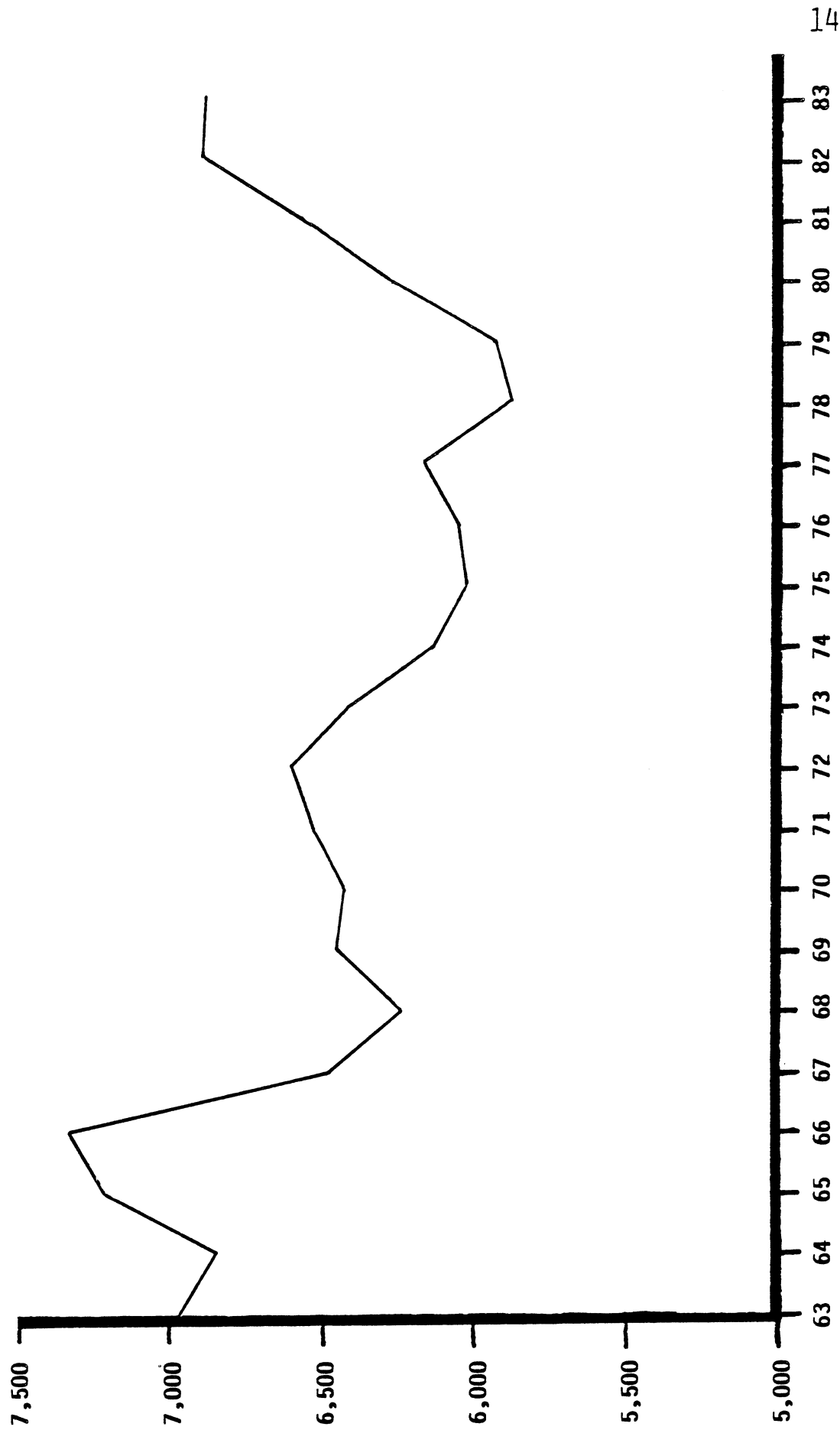

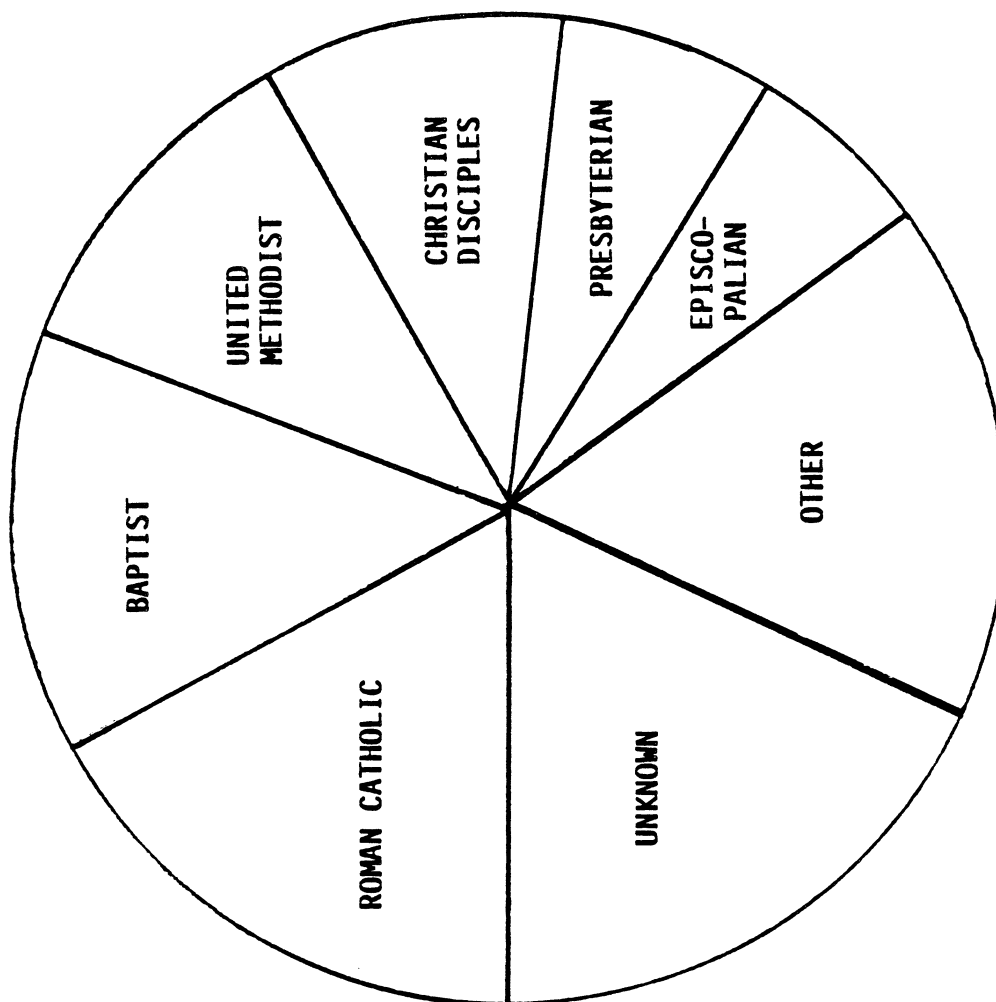

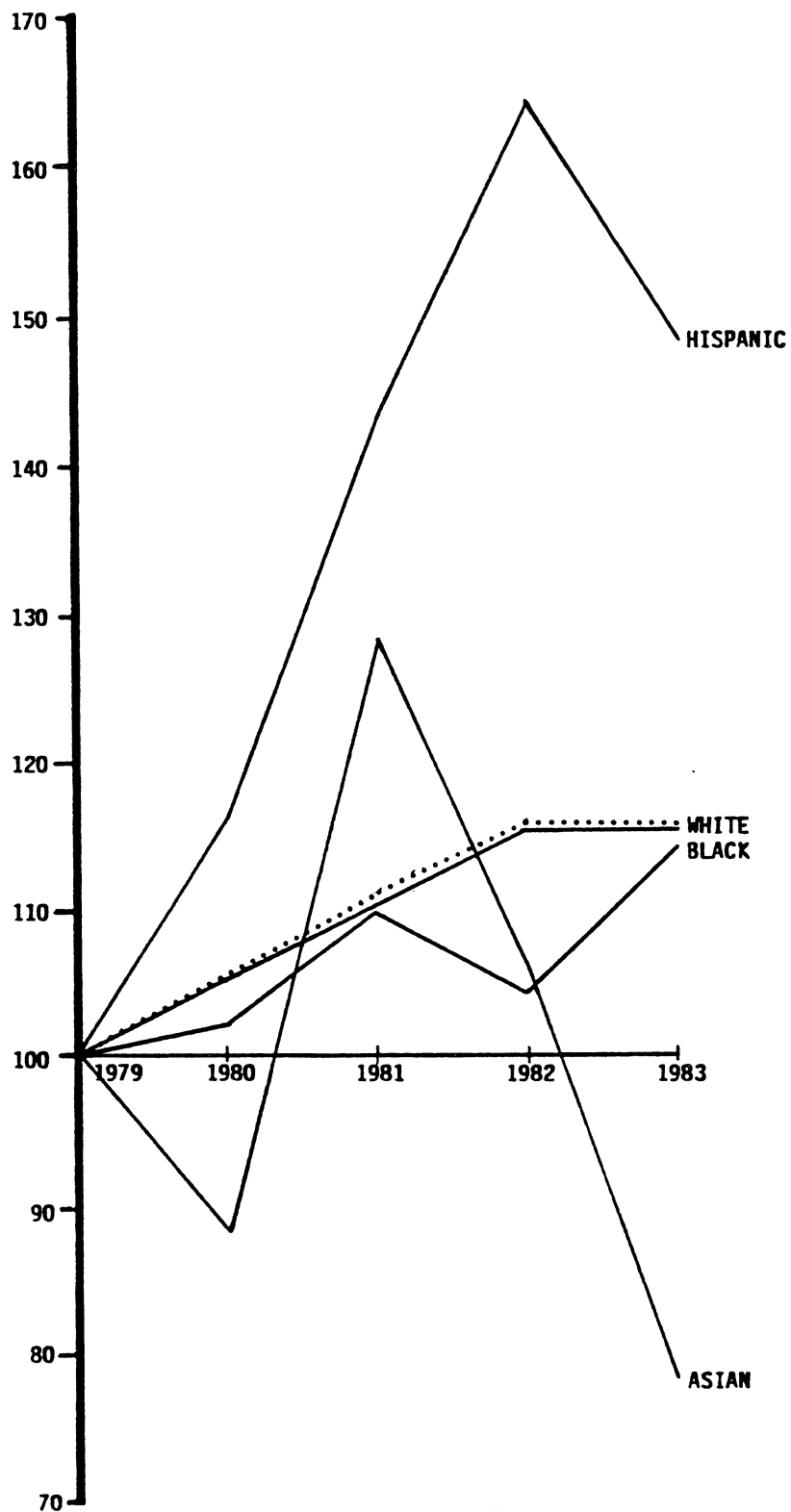

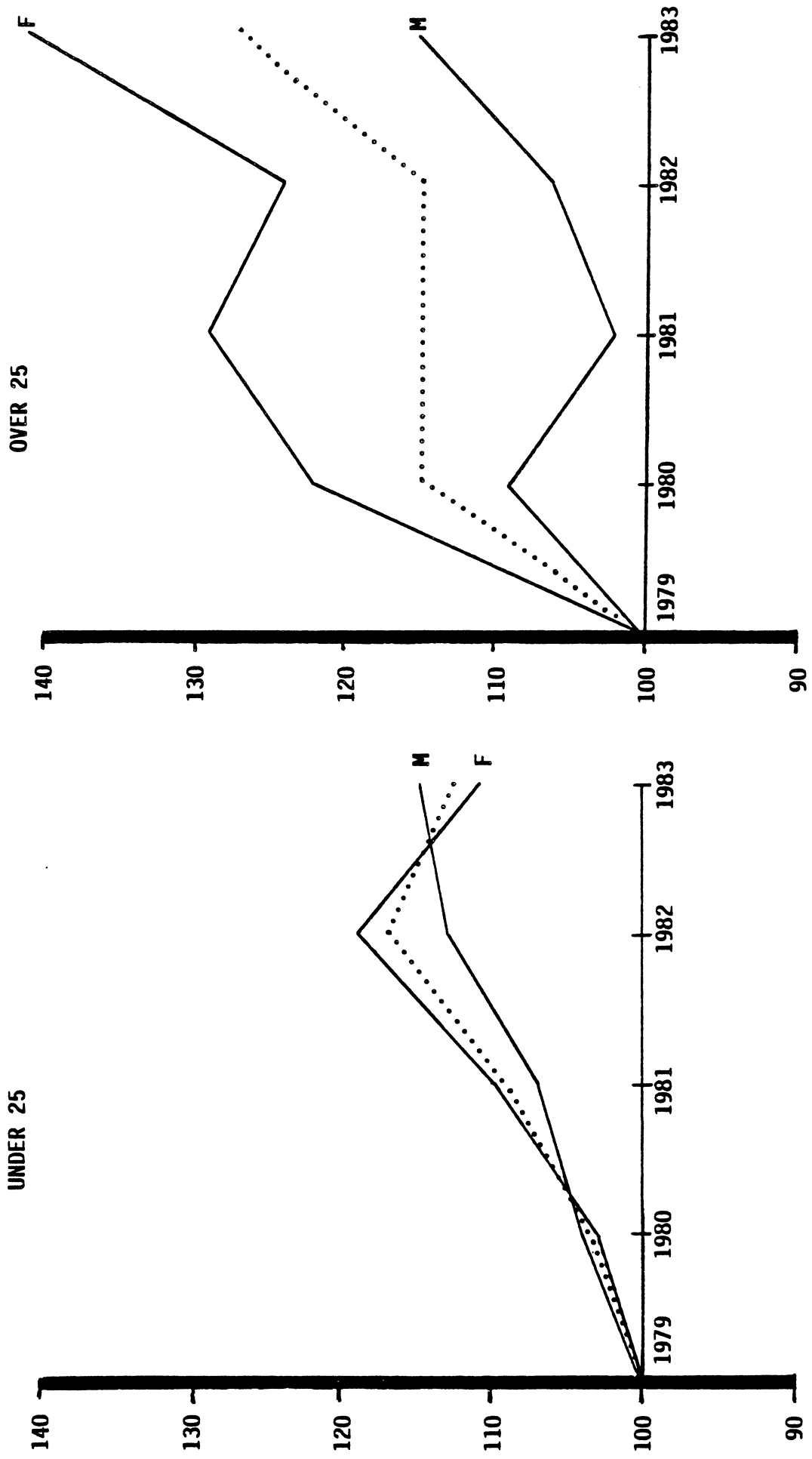

HISTORICAL AGE DISTRIBUTION OF STUDENTS BY SEX

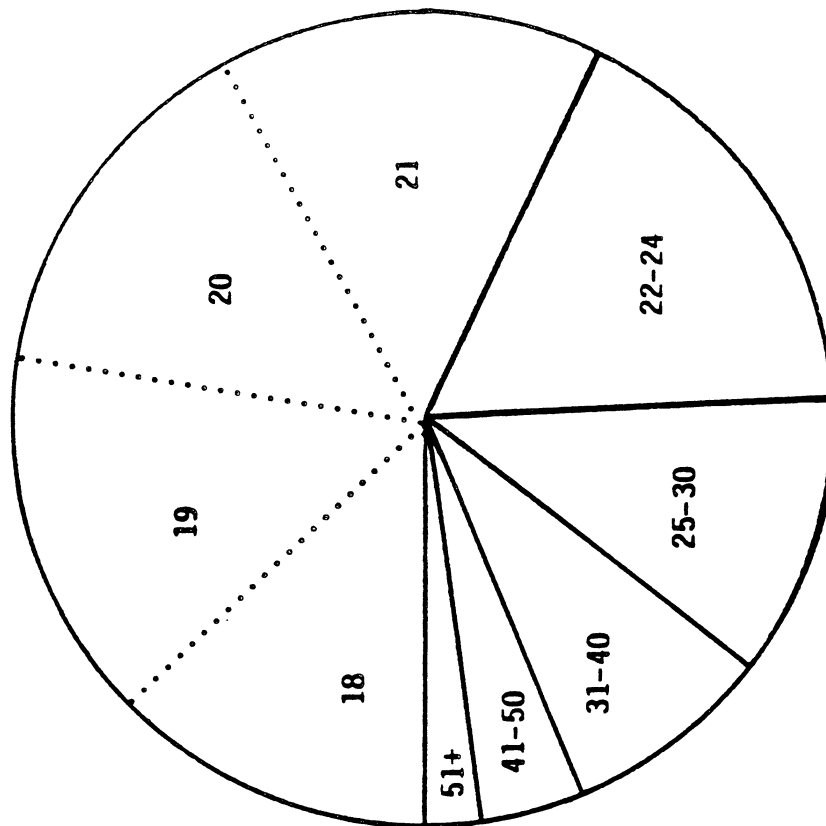

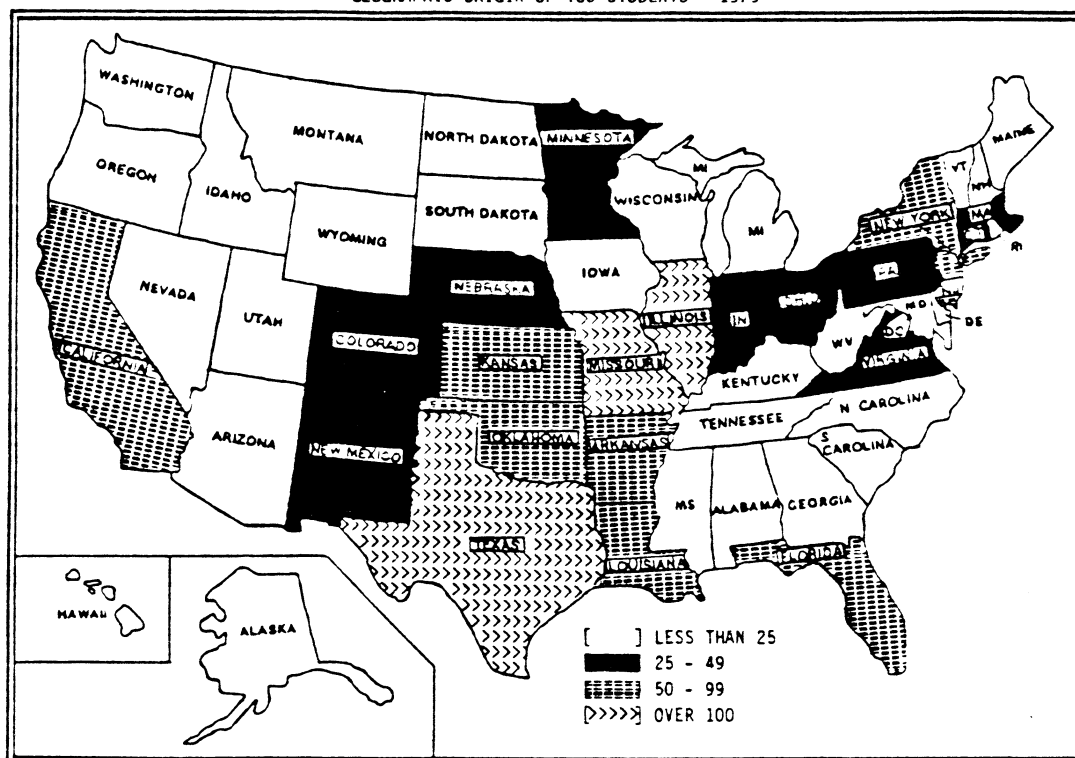

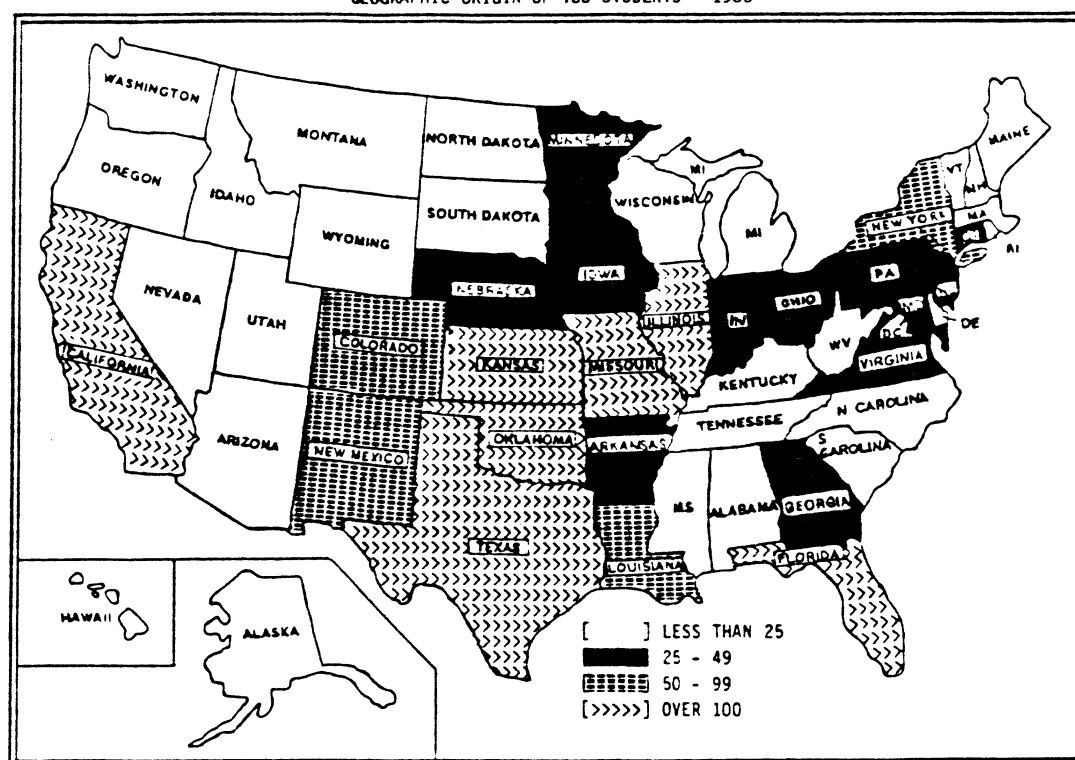
TEXAS CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY GEOGRAPHIC ORIGIN OF TCU STUDENTS

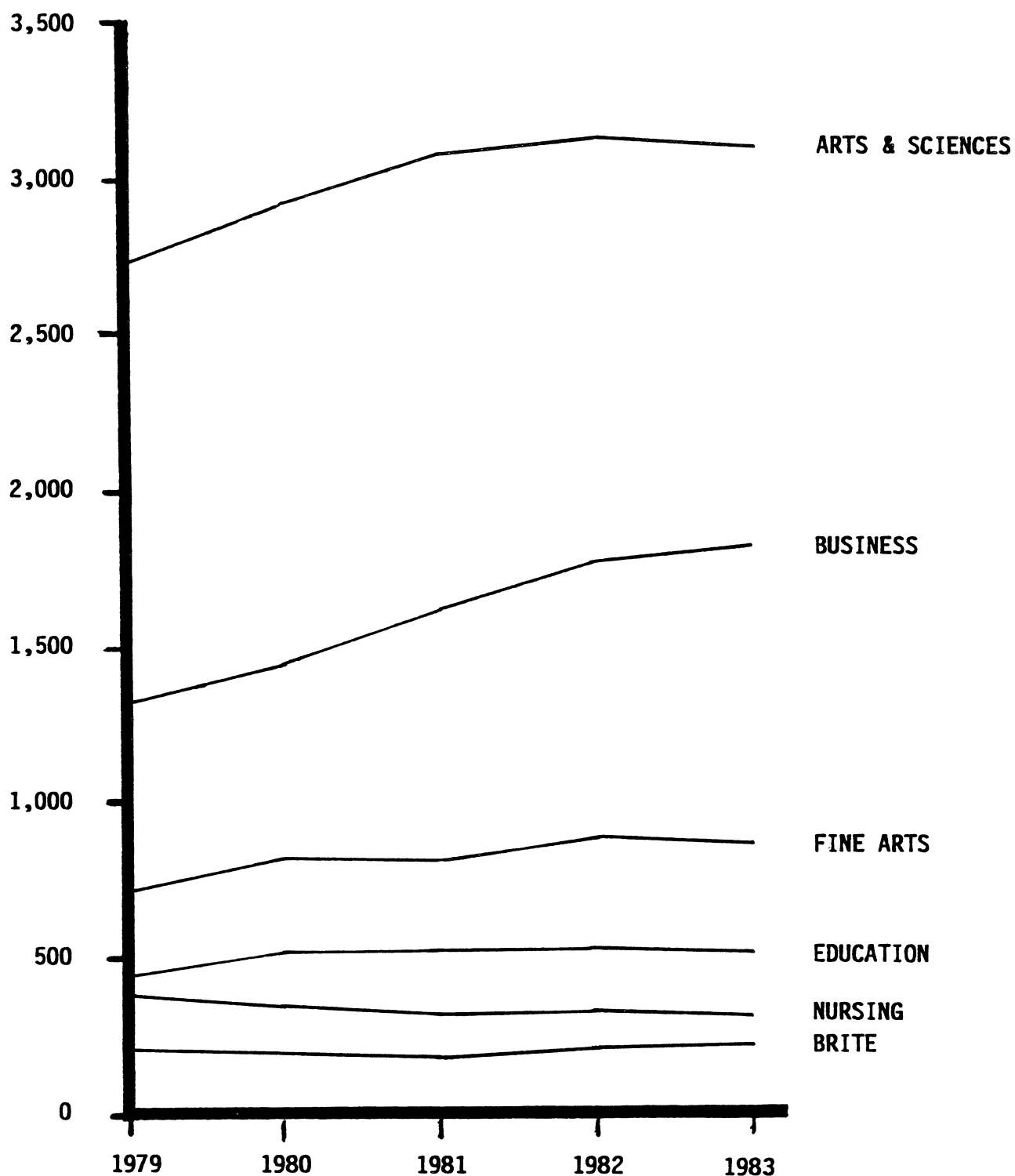

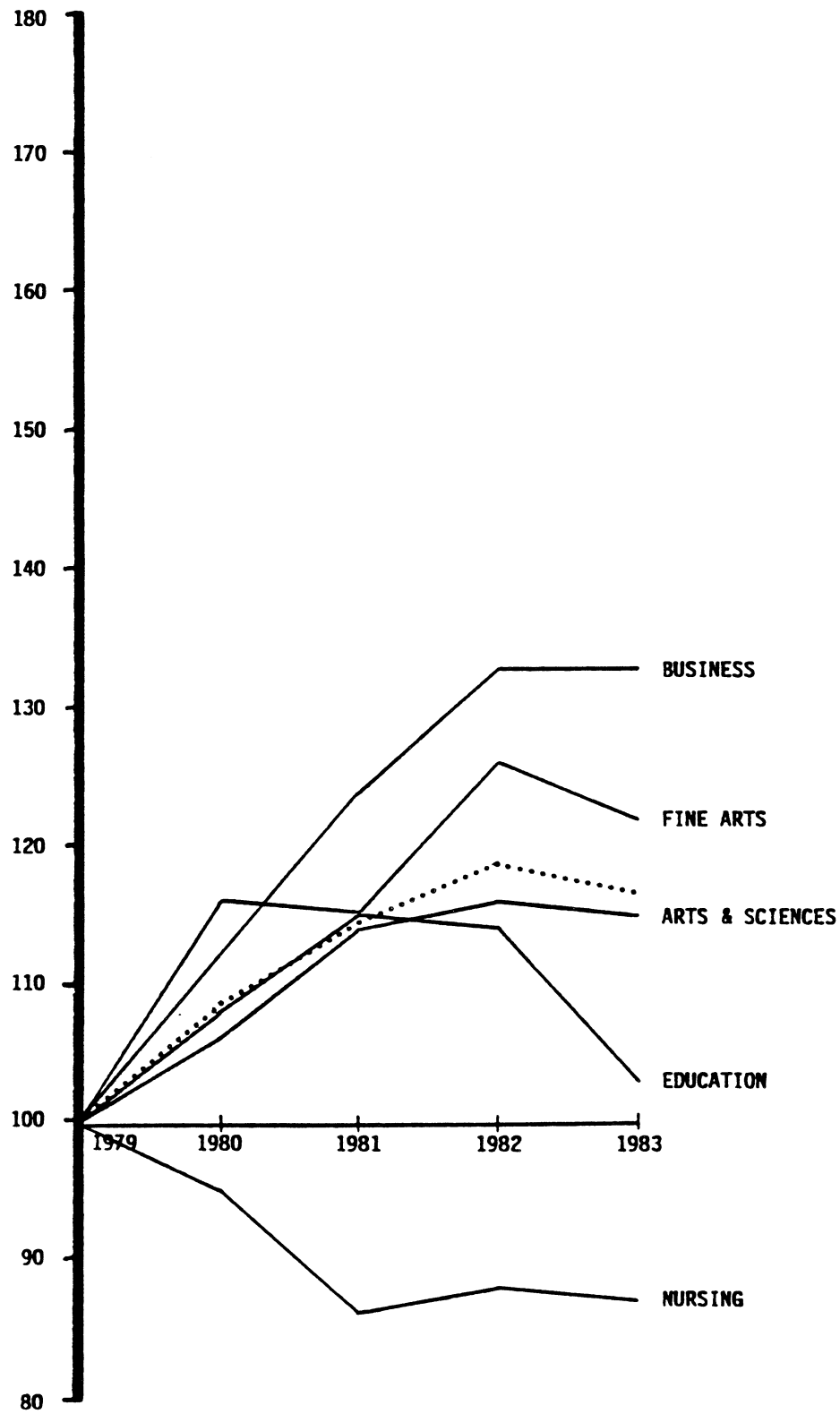

ACADEMIC PROGRAM DATA HIGHLIGHTS

- Credit hours produced as of the date of 100% tuition refund increased less than 1% compared to the same time period for Fall 1982.
- The production of credit hours by the School of Business increased 11% over last year, while AddRan, Education and Fine Arts showed decreases of 1 - 5% compared to a year earlier.
- Original Credit Hours have increased steadily for the last five fiscal years. Credit hours generated by the total University in FY83 were 16% higher than in FY79.
- Credit hours generated by Education increased 7.5%, while AddRan and Fine Arts increased 16% over the five-year period. Business, however, generated 48% more credit hours in FY83 than in FY79.
- Credit hours per F.T.E. faculty ranged from 83.9 in Nursing to 320.6 in Business. The TCU Corporation average was 227.6 and the University average was 214.5. With the exception of Fine Arts and Brite, credit hours per F.T.E. faculty decreased slightly compared to last year.
- One-third of the undergraduate sections taught for Fall 1983 had original enrollments below the generally acceptable size of 12 for lower division classes and eight for upper division classes. Seventeen percent of the undergraduate sections had enrollments larger than 36 students.
- The percentage of A's awarded in lower division classes appeared to decline. Only Education awarded more than 50% A's at this level (in all probability due to the large number of P.E. Activity courses). Again, except for Education, all upper division classes awarded less than 40% A's.
- The 1983-84 TCU catalog listed 67 programs where the bachelor's degree could be awarded, 50 master's programs and six doctoral programs.
- The number of doctorates awarded for 1983 was double the number awarded in 1982. The 1983 class also represented the largest undergraduate graduating class in the five-year period from 1979 to 1983.

FACULTY AND STAFF DATA HIGHLIGHTS

- The Fall 1983 full-time-equivalent instructional faculty at TCU increased one percent over a year ago and represented the largest F.T.E. faculty in five years.
- The number and F.T.E. of teaching assistants continued to decline. The largest number of teaching assistants was concentrated in the English department.
- Thirty-one new faculty joined the staff for Fall 1983.
- The average age of the faculty remained unchanged except for the rank of assistant professor where the age increased from 37 to 40. Length of service remained unchanged.
- Sixty-four percent of the faculty were tenured as of Fall 1983; another 28% were eligible for tenure. Over 80% of the faculty in the following departments were tenured: Biology, Chemistry, Economics, Mathematics, Physics, Guidance/Counseling and Theatre. In relation to five years ago, AddRan and Fine Arts had a larger percentage of tenured faculty.
- The student to faculty ratio dropped to under 18 to 1. Only the School of Business continued to have a student to faculty ratio greater than 20 to 1.
- The student to faculty ratio exceeded 20 to 1 in the following departments: Religion Studies, Economics, Accounting, Management, Reading Education and Radio-TV-Film.
- The average assistant professor's salary was 63% of the average full professor's salary and 82% of the average associate's salary.
- Since 1979, the all ranks average faculty salary had increased 60% from \$19,120 to \$30,640.
- The faculty comprised the largest single category of personnel (30%) followed by clerical (23%) and service (19%). The administrative staff represented 11% of the total personnel.
- The size of the support staff in relation to the faculty remained unchanged at 2.3 to 1.
- Approximately one-half (48%) of all TCU employees were budgeted for the academic component - teaching, research and academic support.
- In Fall 1983, over one-third (35%) of the administrative staff and over half (53%) of the professional staff were female. Approximately one-third (30%) of the faculty were female.
- Approximately one-fourth (24%) of the administrative staff held the doctoral degree. Almost four-fifths (79%) of the faculty held the terminal degree for their discipline.

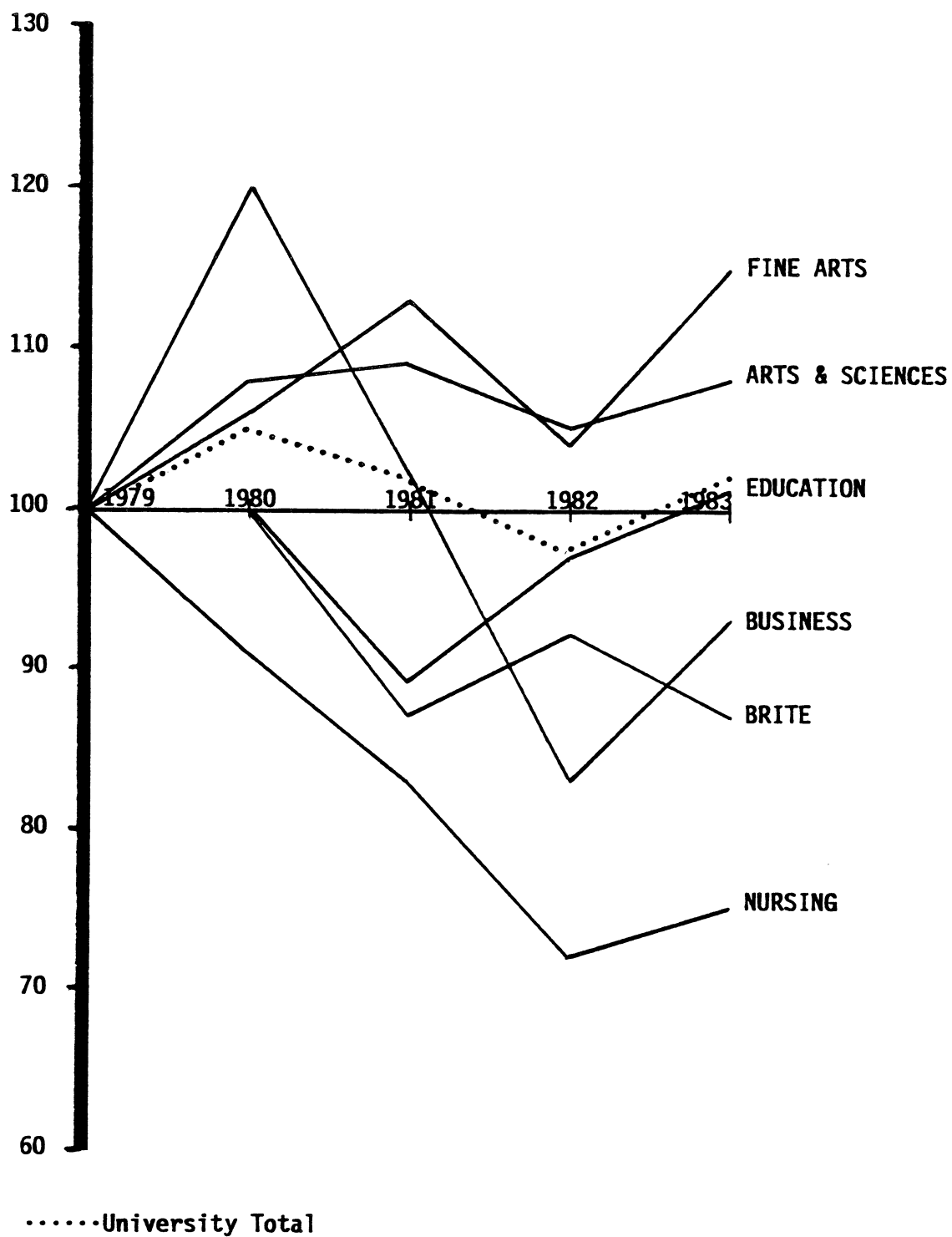

BY SCHOOL/COLLEGE

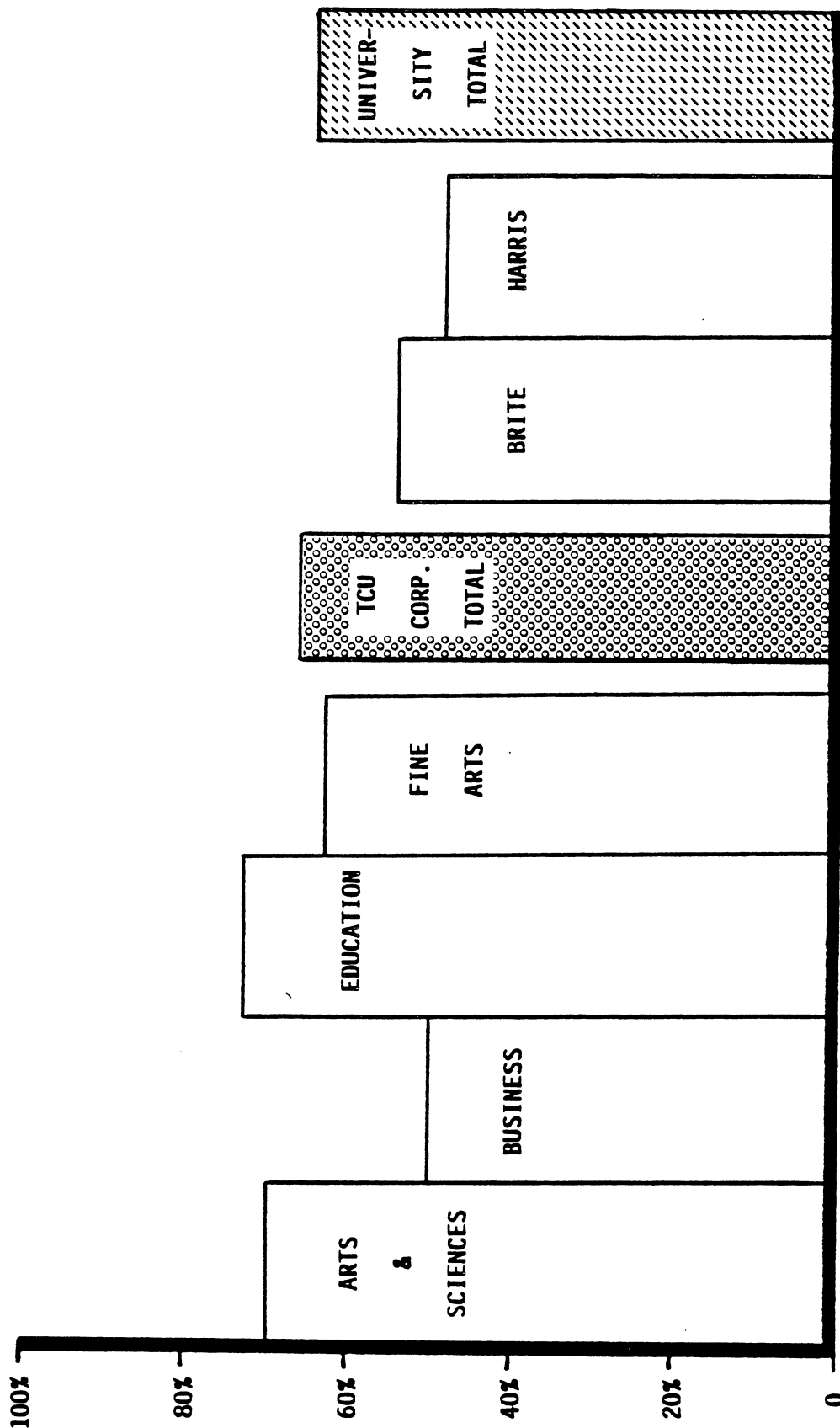

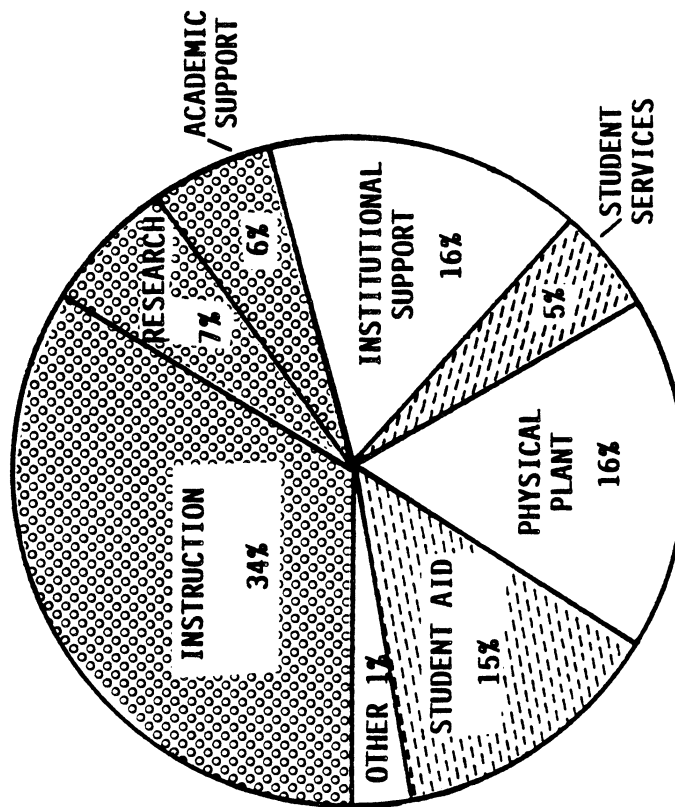
- Tuition and fees were the source of 51% of the funds expended for fiscal 1983. Slightly more than one-fourth (27%) of the funds came from endowment income.
- Expenditures of funds for the academic component of instruction, research and academic support accounted for 47% of the funds applied. One-fifth of the educational and general funds applied went to provide student aid and student services.
- Since 1967, tuition charges at TCU increased from \$40 to \$140 per credit hour. The 1983 charge was still below the national average for independent colleges and universities.
- Over 40% of the \$8.5 million disbursed in financial aid for 1982-83 came from federal sources. During the past 10 years, federal aid accounted for as little as 35% and as much as 54% of aid awarded.
- While the dollar amount of institutional aid increased every year since 1973, the proportion dropped from 42% to 34%.
- The cost of energy rose from slightly over \$1.1 million in 1979-80 to a budgeted amount just under \$3 million for the 1983-84 year.
- Almost half (46%) of the total space at TCU was devoted to academic and general use. Another 37% was devoted to residence halls and apartments.
- Fifty-eight percent of the square footage at TCU was more than 20 years old in 1983.

FISCAL YEAR ENDED MAY 31, 1983

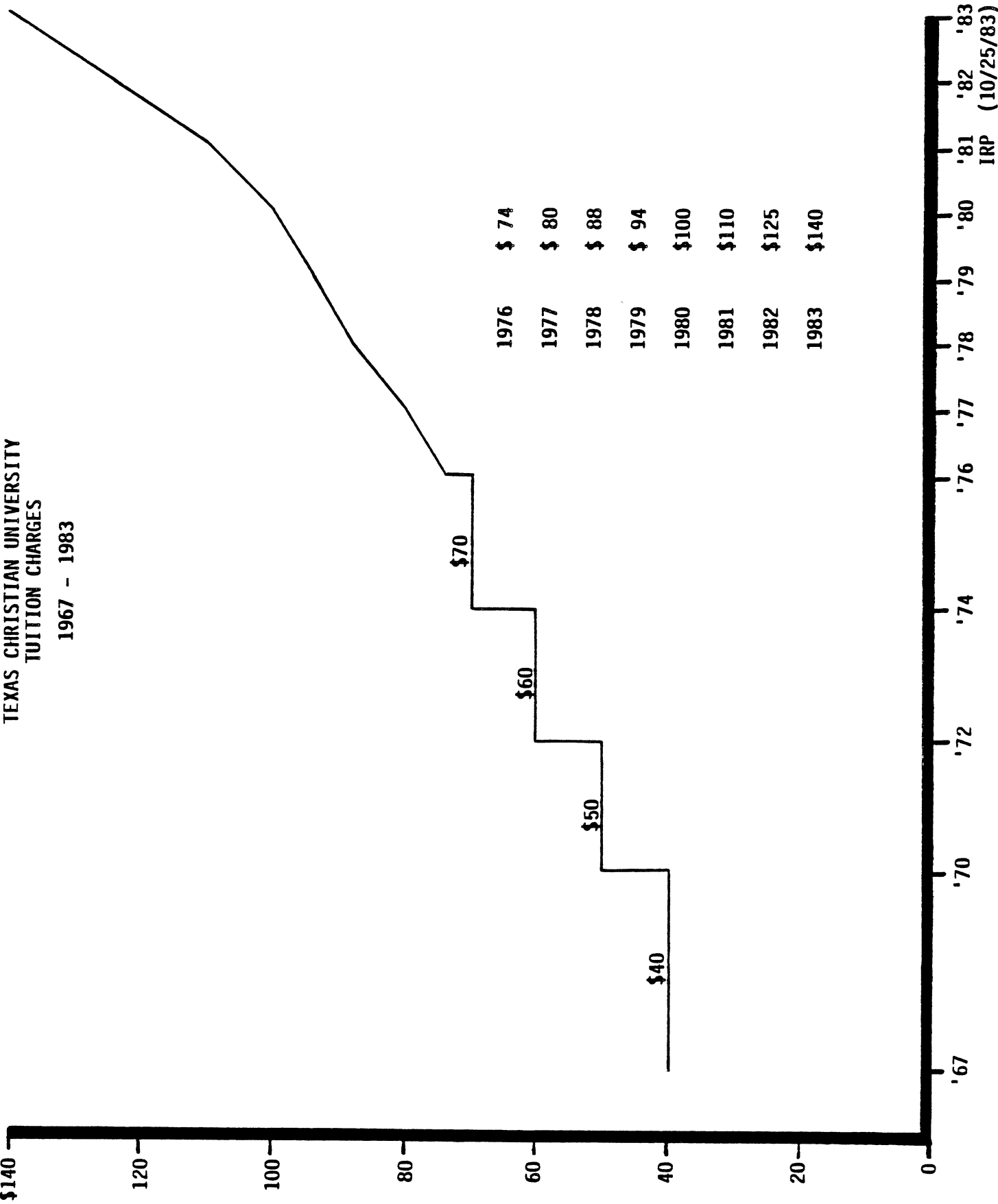
Sources of Expended Funds

1967 - 1983

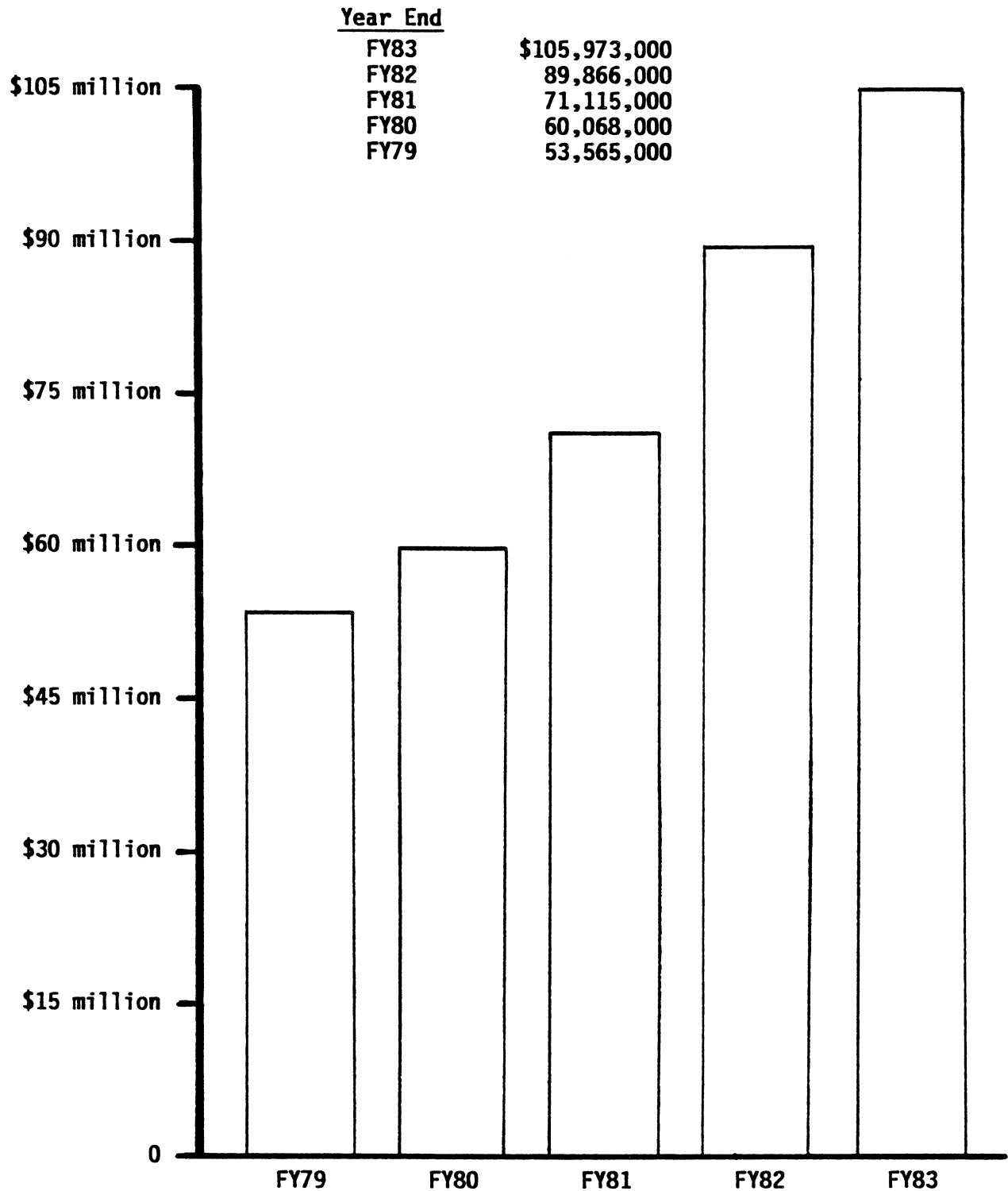

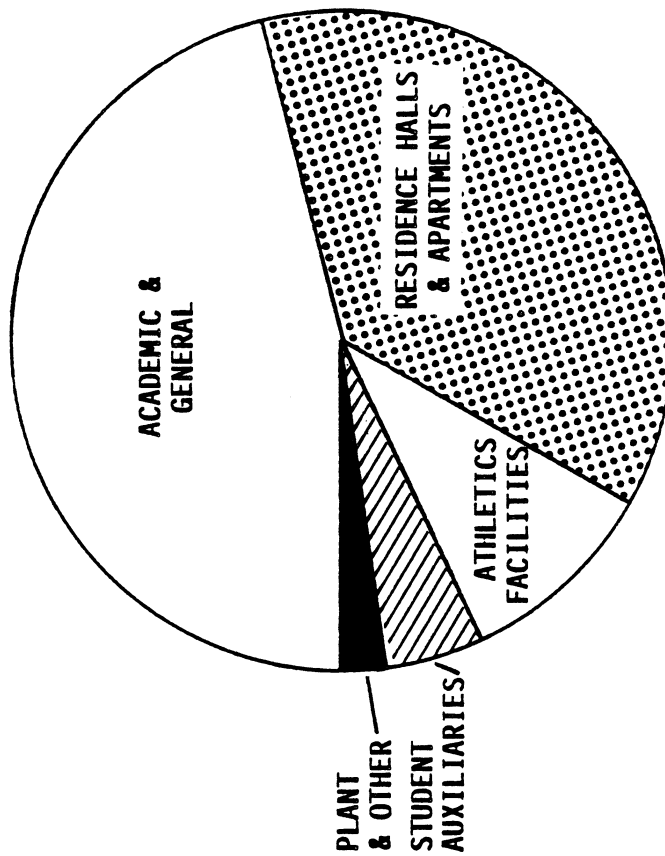

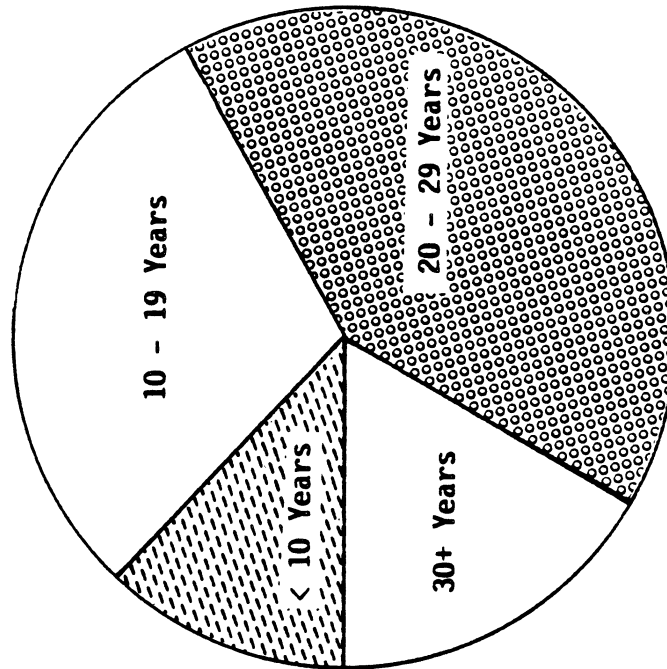

Fall 1983

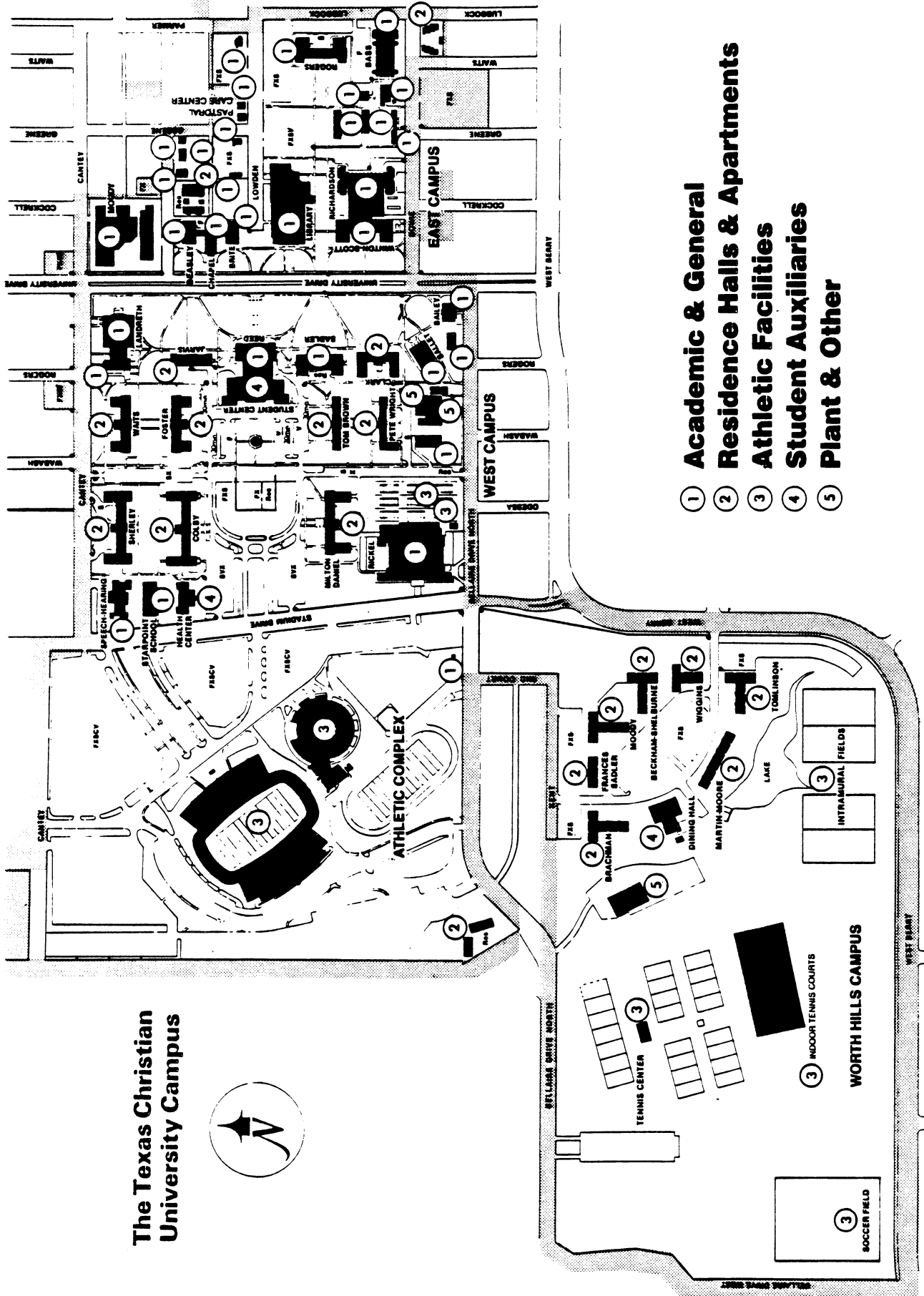
