INTRODUCTION

This summary of material was compiled by the Office of Institutional Research and Planning with the assistance and input of various other offices. The purpose of this document is to serve as a ready reference which provides a point-in-time picture of Texas Christian University.

The data included in this document are organized into four major areas: Student Data, Academic Program Data, Faculty and Staff Data, and Resource Data. Data based on the Fall 1984 statistics have been combined and supplemented with historical data in each area. While most summaries are based on Fall statistics, some are based on the Fiscal Year Ended May 31, 1984.

Sources of data are included at the conclusion of each section. Unusual or confusing terms are defined in the foreword of the document. The graphics package has been expanded to include a visual interpretation of most of the data elements.

Because the official census date and the method of calculation has been changed in a number of areas, users are urged to exercise caution when comparing Fall 1984 data to prior years. Fluctuations may be due to system changes rather than breaks in trends.

DEFINITIONS

Credit Hours -

Original - based on original registration before any hours are dropped and/or added. Not available beginning Fall 1984.

100% Refund - based on hours dropped and/or added as of the date of 100% tuition refund.

Twelfth Class Day - the twelfth day of class. For Fall 1984, this day was September 10, 1984. Official statistics come from twelfth class day beginning Fall 1984.

Eligible for Tenure - Full time faculty members who are in permanent, tenure-track positions on the TCU Budget.

Fiscal Year - The fiscal year begins June 1 and ends May 31. Resource data are reported by fiscal year, and fiscal year credit hour reports are based on the spring semester of the year given combined with the fall semester and all summer sessions of the preceding calendar year.

F.T.E. Formulas - see next page.

Full Time Equivalent - The number obtained when part time students, faculty or staff are converted to full time using a variety of formulas. See next page.

Instructional Faculty - Faculty members who devote at least 50% of their time
to classroom instruction.

Maximum Capacity - The number of available beds on campus. It includes those rooms originally built as doubles designated as triples because of large enough square footage. It does not include doubles assigned temporarily as triples.

Non-Academic Support Personnel - Full time and part time personnel at TCU who carry job codes in the 1000, 3000, 4000, 5000, 6000 and 7000 series (Administrative, Professional, Technical, Clerical and Service personnel).

Official Headcount Enrollment - Student enrollment becomes official on the twelfth class day.

Optimal Capacity - The number of beds available when resident assistants do not have roommates and when all rooms originally built as doubles are assigned as double rooms rather than triples.

Optimal Capacity in Greek Houses - The maximum capacity in fraternities and sororities is equal to the optimal occupancy.

Self-Reported Data - Information students report about themselves. This includes ethnicity, major, place of residence (geographic), religion and sex.

TCU Corporation - Consists of the AddRan College of Arts and Sciences, the M.J. Neeley School of Business, the School of Education, the School of Fine Arts and University Programs/Graduate Studies.

Terminal Degree - Includes all doctoral degrees and some master's degrees where the master's is the terminal degree for a chosen field. An example of this is the M.S.S.W. in Social Work.

University Total - Combines total figures for the TCU Corporation, Brite Divinity School and the Harris College of Nursing.

F.T.E. FORMULAS

F.T.E. Student

- 1. Southern Association 12 credit hours = 1.00 F.T.E. student. Example: 82,001 credit hours ÷ 12 = 6,833.42 F.T.E.
- 2. Texas Coordinating Board 15 credit hours = 1.00 F.T.E. student. Example: 82,001 credit hours ÷ 15 = 5,466.73 F.T.E.
- 3. Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS) Undergraduate students carrying 12 or more hours and graduate or Brite students carrying 9 or more hours are considered full time by HEGIS. Part time hours are converted as follows: Undergraduate credit hours ÷ 12, graduate and Brite Divinity School credit hours ÷ 9. This converted number plus the number of full time students equals the F.T.E. This information is compiled from a special HEGIS printout.
- 4. TCU Registrar's Office Students carrying a load of 12 or more semester hours are counted as full time. The loads of part time students are added together and the total is divided by 12. The combined figure is the F.T.E.

F.T.E. Staff

Part time staff are converted to a full time equivalent by dividing the number of hours worked annually by 2,080. For example, a staff member who works 20 hours a week for 52 weeks a year works 1,040 hours \div 2,080 = .50 F.T.E. A staff member who works 40 hours a week for 9 months a year works 1,560 hours \div 2,080 = .75 F.T.E.


F.T.E. Faculty

Part time faculty F.T.E. is computed as follows: 12 hours = 1.00 F.T.E. faculty except in Performance Music (18 clock hours = 1.00) and P.E. (7 hours = 1.00).

STUDENT DATA HIGHLIGHTS

- Although the number of high school students accepted has increased steadily for the past five years, the percentage who actually enroll has declined from 60% to 49%. The fact that TCU has revised the admissions standards (i.e., recruits and accepts students with better SAT scores and high school grades) could mean that larger classes must be accepted to maintain actual enrollment yield since the better student has more options available to him/her.
- Over half (52.6%) of the entering 1984 class were ranked in the First Quartile of their high school class. This class entered TCU with an average composite SAT score of approximately 1000.
- The declining freshman enrollment in the School of Education and Harris College of Nursing -- both traditionally female dominated fields -- are indicative of the growing number of career options available to women.
- Despite the change in the date of initial Fall statistics, headcount enroll-ment at TCU has climbed from 6,018 ten years ago to 6,747. During this time span the low point was reached in Fall 1978 (5,874) and the peak in Fall 1982 (6,881).
- The percentage of females enrolled at TCU, like national statistics, exceeded the percentage of males enrolled. However, for the second consecutive year the percentage of females enrolled declined.
- As has been traditional at TCU, over 85% of the student body reported some religious affiliation.
- The proportion of non-minority students enrolled at TCU has remained at 92% for the past five years. The growth of minority enrollments has kept pace with the growth of total enrollments resulting in greater numbers of minority students, though the percentages remained the same.
- Approximately three-fourths of the TCU student body has been under 25 for four of the last five years. Two-thirds of the student body are the traditional college age group -- 18-22 year olds. A slightly greater proportion of men tend to be older (35.9% over 22 compared with 30.1% for the female population).
- More than 100 students from Texas, Oklahoma, Kansas, Missouri, Illinois, Florida and California enrolled at TCU for Fall 1984. A closer look at comparative geographic statistics indicated an increase in students from states in the south and midwest and a decline in the number of students drawn from the northeast. Such changes over the past five years reflect the population shifts of the nation as a whole.
- The percentage of foreign students has remained unchanged for the past five years. The largest number of foreign students came from Canada and Mexico.
- Housing statistics indicated 99% of optimal capacity with 2,922 (43%) students living on campus for Fall 1984. Over half of the undergraduate students live on campus.











TEXAS CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY HISTORICAL AGE DISTRIBUTION OF STUDENTS BY SEX






TEXAS CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY GEOGRAPHIC ORIGIN OF TCU STUDENTS

ACADEMIC PROGRAM DATA HIGHLIGHTS

- Credit Hours for Fall 1984 were compiled on the Twelfth Class Day, September 10, 1984. While these numbers are now comparable with state institutions, they are not comparable with hours reported in past years by TCU.
- Credit hours compiled at the end of 100% refund period are the most comparable to past years, though these numbers also must be used with extreme caution. At the point of 100% refund, students were enrolled for 82,591 hours for Fall 1984 compared with 83,537.5 hours a year earlier. This represents a decline of 1.1%, slightly less than the 1.9% decline in headcount enrollment.
- Credit hours per F.T.E. faculty ranged from 84.8 in Nursing to 283.5 in the School of Business. The University average dropped for the third consecutive year to 212.5.
- The Section Size Report for Fall 1984 indicated the average Lower Division class has just over 20 students; Upper Division just under 19; and Graduate Division just over 5. One-fifth of the Lower Division sections enrolled 12 or fewer students; 29% of the Upper Division sections enrolled eight or fewer.
- A grade distribution history for Fall 1979 Fall 1983 indicated a mixed pattern ending in an upward swing in the percentage of A's at the Lower Division in Education and a downward then steady trend in Fine Arts. At the Upper Division Level all Schools/Colleges appear to be below Fall 1979 percentage of A's except Education and Nursing.
- The number of degrees awarded for 1984 was the highest during the five year period since 1980. In comparison to five years ago, the proportion of bachelor's degrees has grown. While the masters and doctorates have remained stable in terms of numbers they have declined as a proportion of the total.

TEXAS CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY DEGREES AWARDED 1980 - 1984 (Indexed 1980=100)





FACULTY & STAFF DATA HIGHLIGHTS

- The full-time equivalent faculty for Fall 1984 declined 4.21 F.T.E. (1.1%), returning to the Fall 1982 staffing level. The F.T.E. Instructional Faculty declined less than the headcount enrollment which dropped 1.9%.
- The number and F.T.E. of teaching assistants continued to decline. Teaching assistants only assumed complete teaching responsibilities in the English and History departments.
- Thirty new faculty joined the staff for Fall 1984.
- The average age of the faculty stood at 46. There were no significant changes in the average ages for the ranks. The School of Business had the youngest faculty -- average age 41.
- Sixty-three percent of the faculty held tenure in Fall 1984; an additional 27% were tenure eligible. Over 80% of the faculty in the following departments were tenured: Biology, Chemistry, Mathematics, Physics, Economics, and Theatre-Ballet & Modern Dance. All colleges/schools had a smaller percentage of tenured faculty in 1984 than in 1980 except Fine Arts.
- The student to faculty ratio dropped slightly to 17.7:1. Although the School of Business still had a ratio over 20 to 1 (actually 23.6 to 1) the ratio continued to improve over the past three years.
- The student to faculty ratio exceeded 20 to 1 in the following areas: Religion Studies, Geology, Mathematics, Economics, Political Science, Accounting, Management, Marketing, Radio-TV-Film, and Speech Communication. In Fall 1983, six departments had student to faculty ratios in excess of 20:1.
- Average faculty salaries for each rank exceeded the AAUP Category I 40th percentile reported in <u>Academe</u>. The 1984 averages are projected to remain above the 40th percentile.
- The average assistant professor's salary has grown by 51% in the past five years. The average salary for a full professor has increased 58% over the same time period.
- The total faculty and support personnel increased by less than one percent during the past three years. The faculty represented 30% of the total staff employed at TCU for Fiscal 1984-85. The next largest groups of staff were the clerical group (23%) and the services group (19%).
- The proportion of administrative and professional positions filled by females increased slightly for 1984. Thirty percent of the faculty was female, the same proportion as a year ago.
- Over one-fifth (22%) of the administrative staff held the doctoral degree.
 Almost four-fifths of the faculty held the terminal degree in their field.








- Tuition and Fees were the source of 53% of the funds expended for 1984.
 Slightly more than one-fourth (27%) of the funds came from endowment income.
- Forty-eight percent of the funds expended were expended for the academic components of instruction, research and academic support.
- Tuition charges at TCU increased from \$100/credit hour in 1980 to \$150/credit hour for 1984.
- Gifts to TCU amounted to \$9.9 million for Fiscal 1984 compared with \$9.8 million a year earlier.
- Book Value of the endowment more than doubled in the last five years and exceeded \$131 million by the end of Fiscal 1984.
- Institutional Aid to students has continued to increase dramatically from \$1.8 million in 1979-80 to \$3.4 million for 1983-84. All types of student financial aid except Federal aid has increased. After peaking in 1980-81 at \$4.8 million, federal student aid has dropped to \$3.6 million. Despite the trends, Federal financial aid still provided the largest single portion of aid awarded at TCU (38%).
- Library holdings exceeded the 1.1 million point, a 12.1% increase in the last five years.
- Total utility expenditures for Fiscal 1984 increased by less than one-half a percent. Expenditures for gas actually declined. Expenditures for water increased 2.9%; electricity, one percent.
- Approximately three-fifths of the square footage at TCU was more than 20 years old in 1984.



TEXAS CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY AND AFFILIATES BOOK VALUE OF ENDOWMENT FY80 - FY84






