# Institutional Statistics

#### INTRODUCTION

This summary of material was compiled by the Office of Institutional Research and Planning with the assistance and input of various other offices. The purpose of this document is to serve as a ready reference which provides a point-in-time picture of Texas Christian University.

The data included in this document are organized into four major areas: Student Data, Academic Program Data, Faculty and Staff Data, and Resource Data. Data based on the Fall 1986 statistics have been combined and supplemented with historical data in each area. While most summaries are based on Fall statistics, some are based on the Fiscal Year Ended May 31, 1986.

Sources of data are included at the conclusion of each section. Unusual or confusing terms are defined in the foreword of the document. The graphics package has been expanded to include a visual interpretation of most of the data elements.

Because the official census date and the method of calculation have changed, users are urged to exercise caution when comparing trend information. Fluctuations may be due to system changes rather than breaks in trends. Information since 1984 was compiled on the twelfth class day and thus is different from prior years. A further change is the inclusion of Harris College of Nursing in the Corporation totals. Data have been restated so as to be comparable.

#### Credit Hours -

**Original** - based on original registration before any hours are dropped and/or added. Not available beginning Fall 1984.

100% Refund - based on hours dropped and/or added as of the date of 100% tuition refund.

**Twelfth Class Day** - the twelfth day of class. For Fall 1986, this day was September 10, 1986. Official statistics come from twelfth class day beginning Fall 1984.

Eligible for Tenure - Full time faculty members who are in permanent, tenure-track positions on the TCU Budget.

**Fiscal Year** - The fiscal year begins June 1 and ends May 31. Resource data are reported by fiscal year, and fiscal year credit hour reports are based on the spring semester of the year given combined with the fall semester and all summer sessions of the preceding calendar year.

F.T.E. Formulas - see next page.

**Full-Time Equivalent** - The number obtained when part-time students, faculty or staff are converted to full-time using a variety of formulas. See next page.

Instructional Faculty - Faculty members who devote at least 50% of their time to classroom instruction.

**Maximum Capacity** - The number of available beds on campus. It includes those rooms originally built as doubles designated as triples because of large enough square footage. It does not include doubles assigned temporarily as triples.

**Non-Academic Support Personnel** - Full-time and part-time personnel at TCU who carry job codes in the 1000, 3000, 4000, 5000, 6000 and 7000 series (Administrative, Professional, Technical, Clerical and Service personnel).

**Official Headcount Enrollment -** Student enrollment becomes official on the twelfth class day.

**Optimal Capacity** - The number of beds available when resident assistants do not have roommates and when all rooms originally built as doubles are assigned as double rooms rather than triples.

**Optimal Capacity in Greek Houses -** The maximum capacity in fraternities and sororities is equal to the optimal occupancy.

**Self-Reported Data** - Information students report about themselves. This includes ethnicity, major, place of residence (geographic), religion and sex.

**TCU Corporation** - Consists of the AddRan College of Arts and Sciences, the M.J. Neeley School of Business, the School of Education, the School of Fine Arts, University Programs/Graduate Studies and Harris College of Nursing. The inclusion of Harris College in the TCU Corporation became effective June 1, 1985.

TCU Sub-Total - Does not include Harris College of Nursing figures and is comparable with TCU Corporation Totals prior to June 1, 1985.

**Terminal Degree** - Includes all doctoral degrees and some master's degrees where the master's is the terminal degree for a chosen field. An example of this is the M.S.S.W. in Social Work.

**University Total -** Combines total figures for the TCU Corporation and Brite Divinity School.

#### F.T.E. FORMULAS

### F.T.E. Student

- 1. <u>Southern Association</u> 12 credit hours = 1.00 F.T.E. student. Example: 84,288 credit hours ÷ 12 = 7,024.00 F.T.E.
- 2.  $\frac{\text{Texas/ICUT}}{\text{Example:}}$  = 15 credit hours = 1.00 F.T.E. student. Example: 84,288 credit hours ÷ 15 = 5,619.20 F.T.E.
- 3. <u>Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS)</u> Undergraduate students carrying 12 or more hours and graduate or Brite students carrying 9 or more hours are considered full-time by HEGIS. Part-time hours are converted as follows: Undergraduate credit hours ÷ 12, graduate and Brite Divinity School credit hours ÷ 9. This converted number plus the number of full-time students equals the F.T.E. This information is compiled from a special HEGIS printout.
- 4. TCU Registrar's Office Uses HEGIS definition.

### F.T.E. Staff

Part-time staff are converted to a full-time equivalent by dividing the number of hours worked annually by 2,080. For example, a staff member who works 20 hours a week for 52 weeks a year works 1,040 hours  $\div$  2,080 = .50 F.T.E. A staff member who works 40 hours a week for 9 months a year works 1,560 hours  $\div$  2,080 = .75 F.T.E.


### F.T.E. Faculty

Part-time faculty F.T.E. is computed as follows: 12 hours = 1.00 F.T.E. faculty except in Performance Music (18 clock hours = 1.00) and P.E. (7 hours = 1.00).

#### STUDENT DATA HIGHLIGHTS

- The Fall 1986 freshman class consisted of 460 males and 718 females and, while smaller than the 1985 class, met the Admissions office 1986 goal.
- Sixty-three percent of the 1986 freshmen graduated in the first quartile of their high school class. Over 92% were in the top half of their high school class, compared to 86% for the 1985 freshman class.
- The proportion of freshmen choosing a Business major increased during the past five years. Arts and Sciences and Nursing continued to decline as student choices for majors.
- During the ten years from Fall 1977 to Fall 1986, headcount enrollment ranged from a low point in 1978 (5,874) to last fall's high of 6,925. The full-time equivalent has remained 87% of the headcount for the past five years. Full-time students accounted for 77% of total enrollment.
- Females accounted for 55.9% of the TCU student body, compared to 51.1% ten years earlier.
- Over four-fifths of the TCU student body indicated a religious affiliation at registration. Over 50% of the students indicated a preference for the following religions: Roman Catholic, Methodist, Baptist or Christian Disciples.
- The proportion of non-minority students increased slightly, but has remained essentially at 92% for the five-year period 1982-1986. The actual number of minority students has increased as enrollments increased.
- Three-fourths of the student body was under the age of 25. Two-thirds of the students fell into the traditional college-age range (18-22). The percentage of female students over the age of 30 dropped from 16.4% a year earlier to 14.0% for Fall 1986.
- Sixty-eight percent of the 1986 student body indicated Texas as their state of origin. Other states from which more than 100 TCU students came included: California (123), Illinois (186), Kansas (154), Missouri (208) and Oklahoma (135). The 1986 student body revealed a substantial increase in the students from Arkansas, Colorado, Minnesota, Nebraska and Tennessee.
- Fall 1986 housing was at 98% of optimal capacity, the lowest in five years.





# TEXAS CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY HISTORICAL AGE DISTRIBUTION OF STUDENTS BY SEX






# TEXAS CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY GEOGRAPHIC SOURCE OF TCU STUDENTS.

### ACADEMIC PROGRAM DATA HIGHLIGHTS

- Credit Hours compiled on the twelfth class day (September 10, 1986) were 84,228, approximately the same as a year earlier.
- Arts and Sciences students took four-fifths of their hours in their own college; Nursing students, 67%; Fine Arts students, 58%; Education students, 54%; and Business students, 47%.
- $\bullet$  Credit Hours generated for fiscal 1986 increased 1.6% from a year earlier.
- The 1,069 bachelor's degrees awarded for 1986 was down slightly from 1985. While the number of masters (265) declined, the number of doctorates awarded increased to 31%.
- The percentage of bachelor's degrees awarded in Education increased
   12.8% from a year earlier. Arts and Sciences increased 6.9%.
- The percentage of females graduating with undergraduate degrees in business represented 37% of the bachelor's graduates. Fifteen percent of the bachelor's in Education were awarded to males.
- $\bullet$  Minorities accounted for 5.5% of the bachelor's degree graduates and 5.4% of the master's degree. A larger proportion of graduates in Education were minority.
- Journalism, Design & Fashion, Psychology and Political Science were the most popular undergraduate majors in Arts and Sciences. Accounting was the most popular Business undergraduate major. Elementary education was the most popular education major and Radio-TV-Film, the most popular Fine Arts major.
- The most popular graduate majors were Business Administration, Divinity and MLA.






# TEXAS CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY PERCENTAGE OF A'S AWARDED BY COLLEGE/SCHOOL





### FACULTY AND STAFF DATA HIGHLIGHTS

- The full-time equivalent faculty increased by five F.T.E. for Fall 1986. As a result the credit hours per F.T.E. faculty decreased from 219.4 to 216.6. The five-year average was 215.8.
- The decrease in credit hours per F.T.E. generated in the School of Business was positive.
- The average faculty member at TCU was 45 years old and had been at the institution for 11 years. The youngest and most recently hired faculty were in the School of Business and the School of Education.
- Sixty-four percent of the faculty were tenured; an additional 31% were on tenure track. Sixty-eight percent of the Arts and Sciences faculty were tenured; 50% of the School of Business faculty were tenured.
- Almost one-third of the faculty appointments were filled by females.
   Three percent of the faculty were minorities.
- The average full professor at TCU was paid \$47,296 -- an increase of 33% in five years. The average salary for associate and assistant professors increased 36% during the same time.
- The student-to-faculty ratio ranged from 6.9 to 1 in Nursing to 22.6 to 1 in Business with a University average of 18 to 1 based on the Southern Association method of computation.
- Faculty comprised 31% of the total staff at the University. Clerical support accounted for 23% as did administrative and professional staff combined.
- The academic component of instruction, research and academic support accounted for 49% of all TCU employees. Institutional support groups accounted for 14% and operation and maintenance groups, 15%.



#### RESOURCE DATA HIGHLIGHTS

- Forty-nine percent of the funds applied for fiscal 1986 were dedicated to the Academic component. Two-fifths of the funds applied for fiscal 1986 were spent on Instruction. The next largest expenditure was for Student Aid (16%).
- Tuition increased 38% during the past five years while the budget doubled.
- Book value of endowment for Texas Christian University and affiliates was \$183.4 million for the fiscal year ended May 31, 1986.
- Gifts at TCU for fiscal 1986 exceeded \$18 million based on figures reported by the Development Office.
- Library holdings increased 3.1% with volumes now in excess of 1.1 million.
- Utility expenditures declined between fiscal 1985 and 1986. Electric and gas charges decreased while water consumption increased.
- Gross square footage at TCU remained constant during the past year, despite renovation and remodeling of assignable square footage.
- Forty-four percent of the assignable square footage on campus was dedicated to the academic components. Housing accounted for the next largest group of 22%.

SOURCES AND APPLICATIONS OF FUNDS FISCAL YEAR ENDED MAY 31, 1986




SOURCES OF EXPLNDED FUNDS



### BOOK VALUE OF ENDOWMENT Fiscal Year 1982 - Fiscal Year 1986




