# INTRODUCTION

This summary of material was compiled by the Office of Institutional Research with the assistance and input of various other offices. The purpose of this document is to serve as a ready reference which provides a point-in-time picture of Texas Christian University.

The information included in this document is organized into seven major data areas: Student Right-to-Know, Entering Freshman, Student, Academic Program, Faculty and Staff, Financial Resource, and Physical Facilities. Data based on the Fall 1997 statistics have been combined and supplemented with historical data in each area. While most summaries are based on Fall statistics, some are based on the fiscal year ended May 31, 1997.

All data are compiled on the twelfth class day and are comparable from year-to-year; however, changes in methods of calculation may have occurred. Footnotes on specific tables call attention to significant differences.

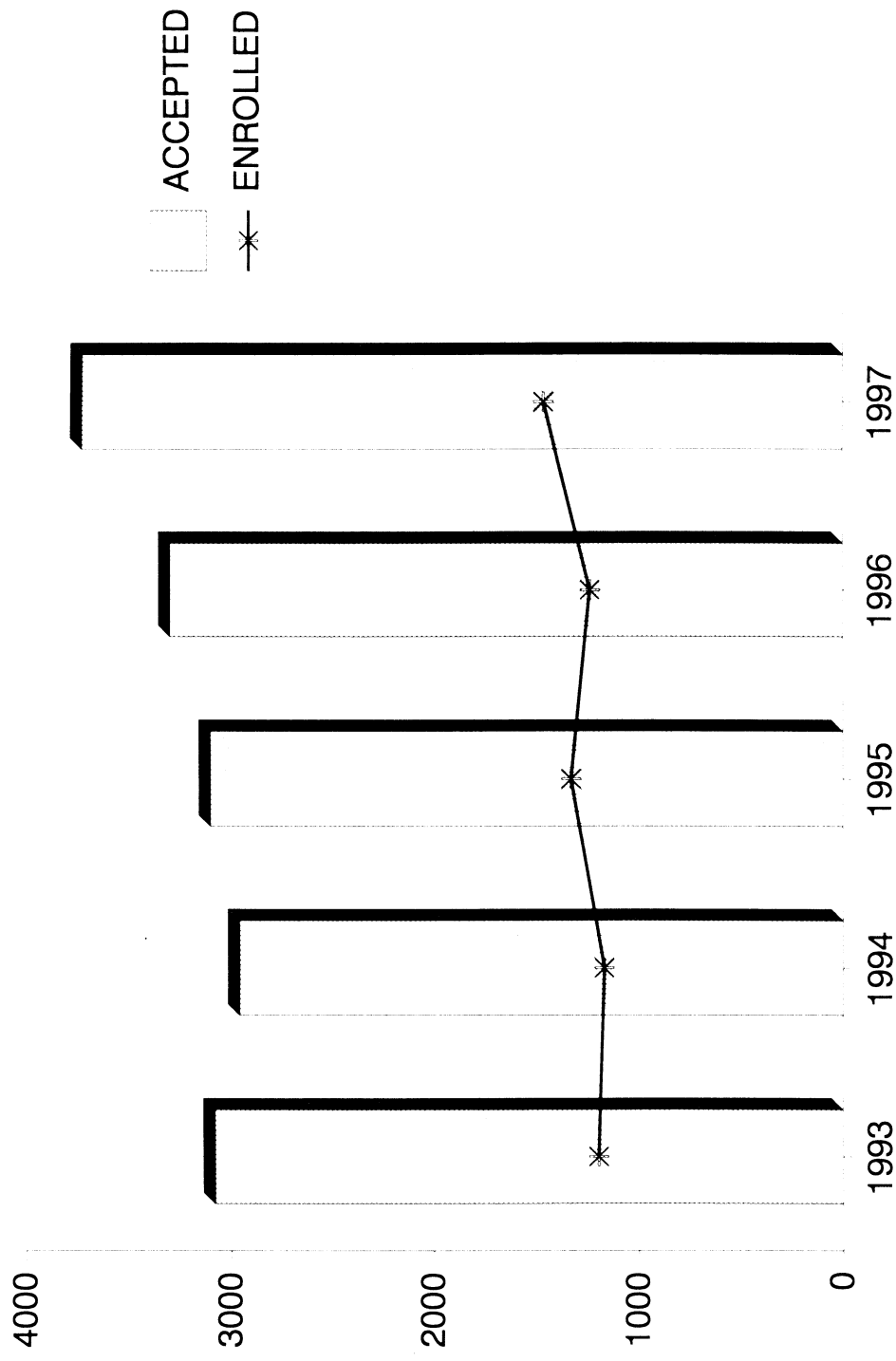

FALL 1993 - FALL 1997



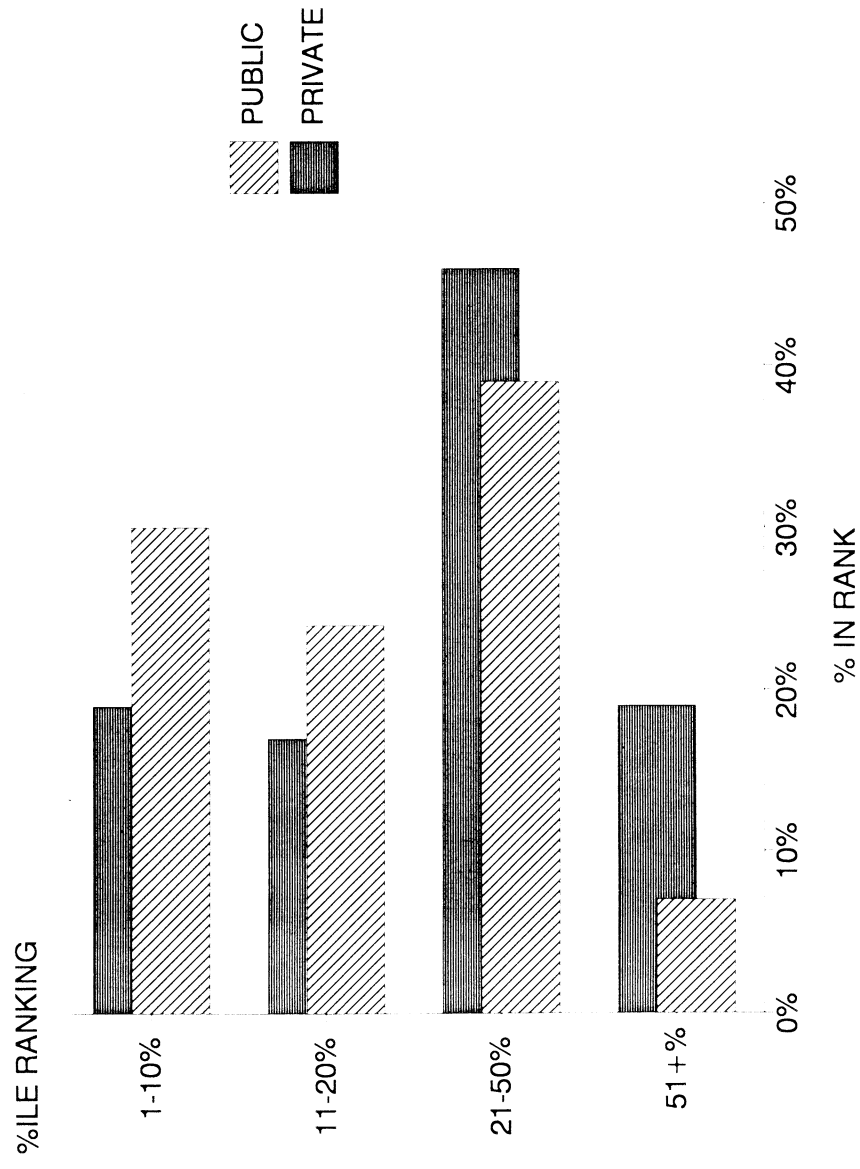

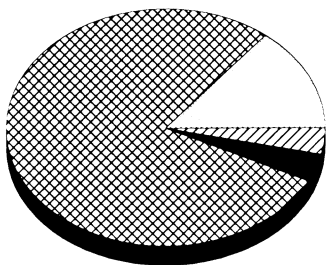

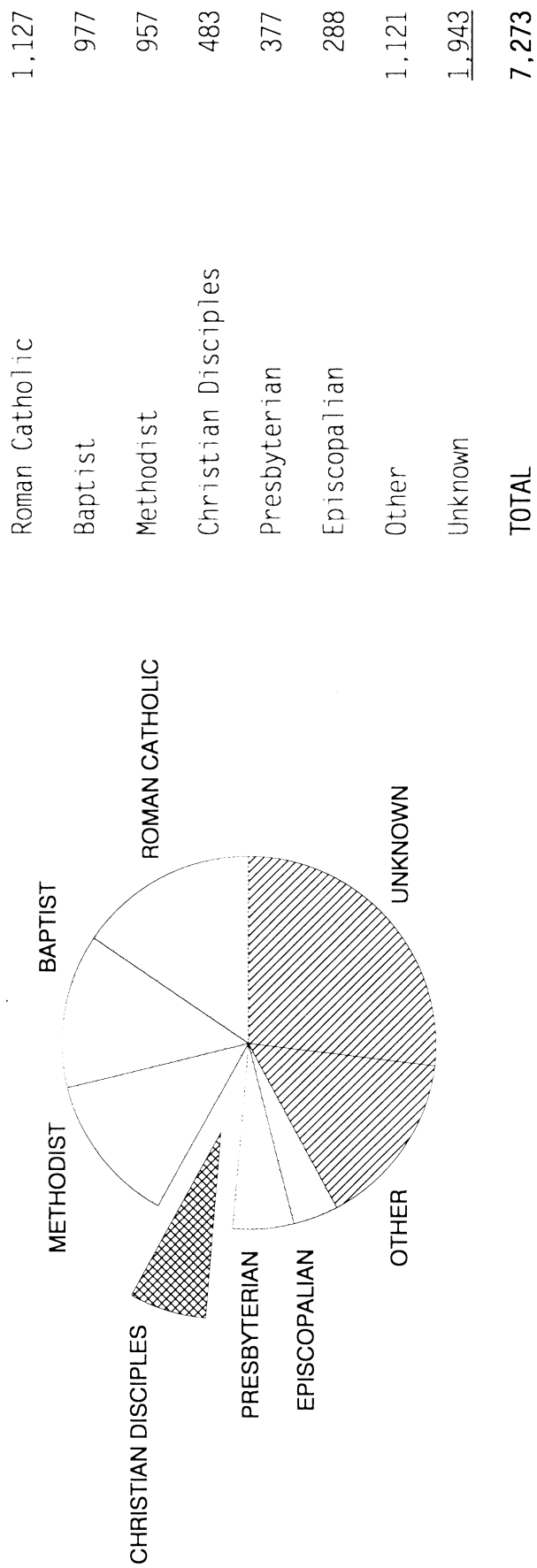

BY RELIGIOUS AFFILIATION

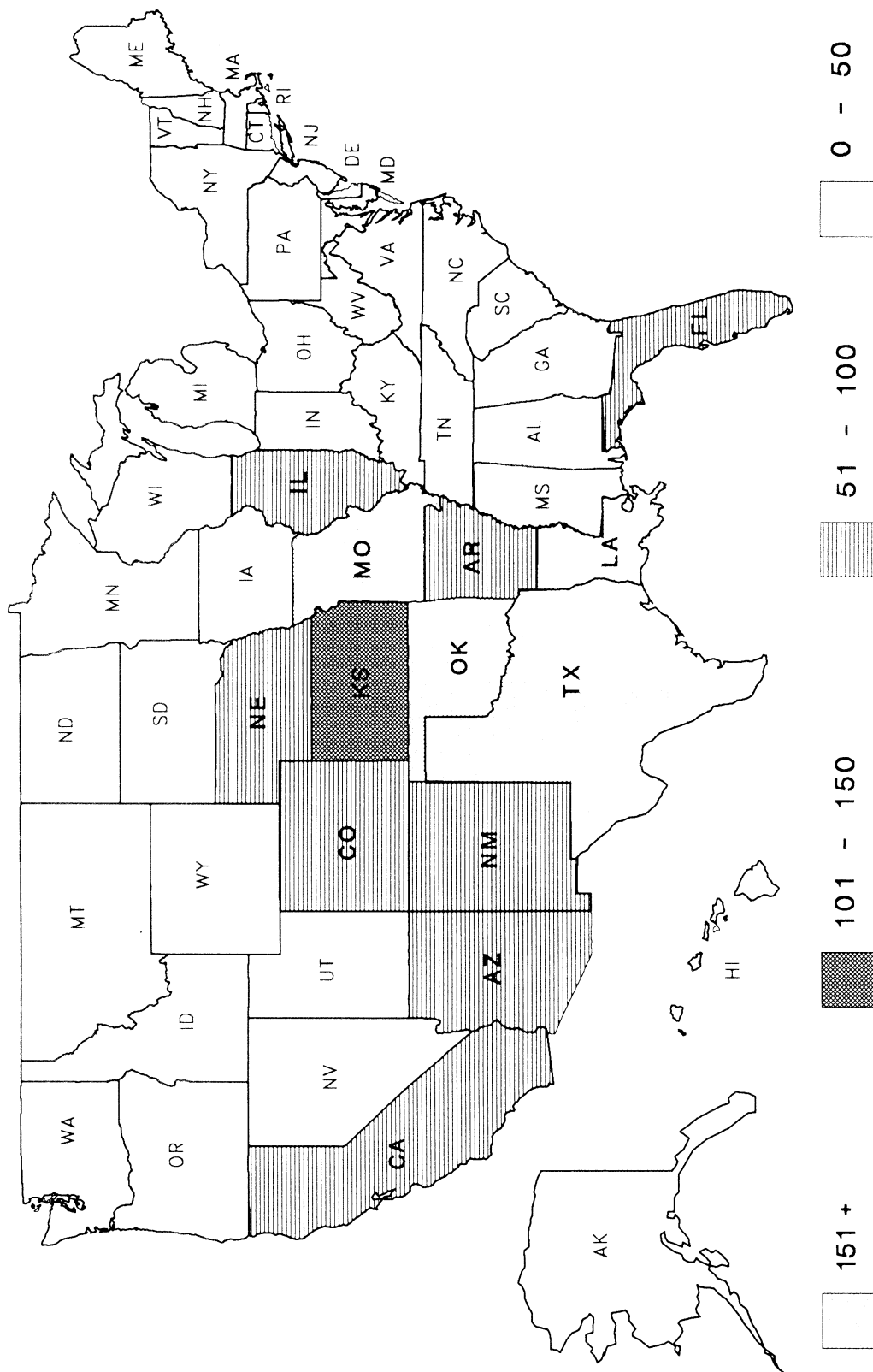

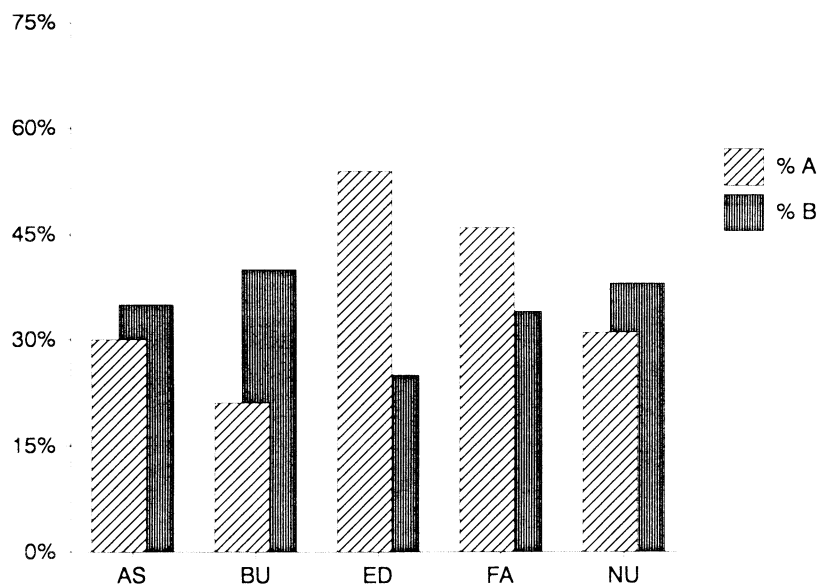

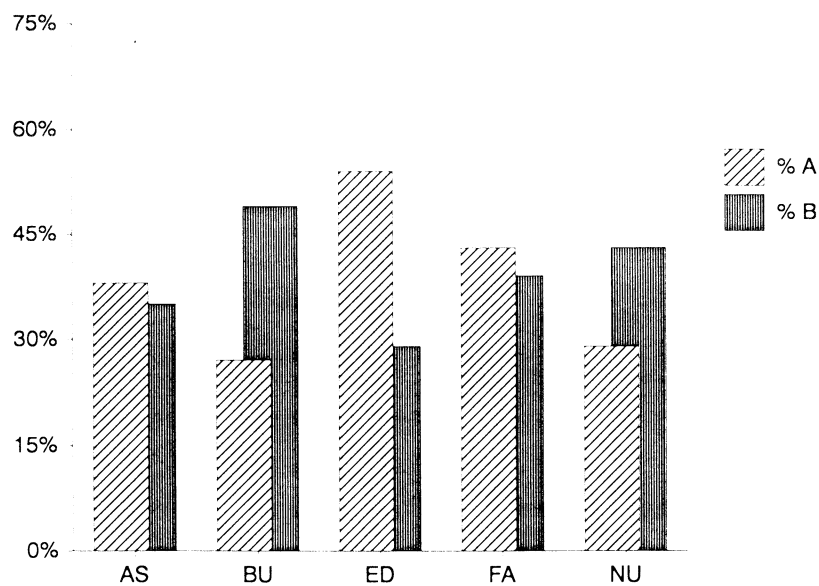

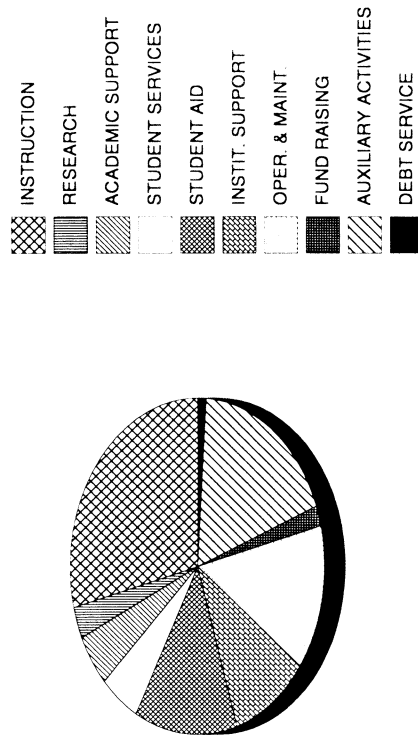

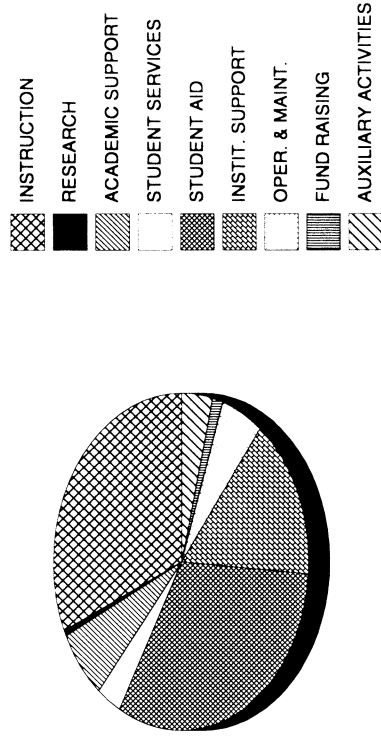
# BRIE DIVINITY SCHOOL OPERATING REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES

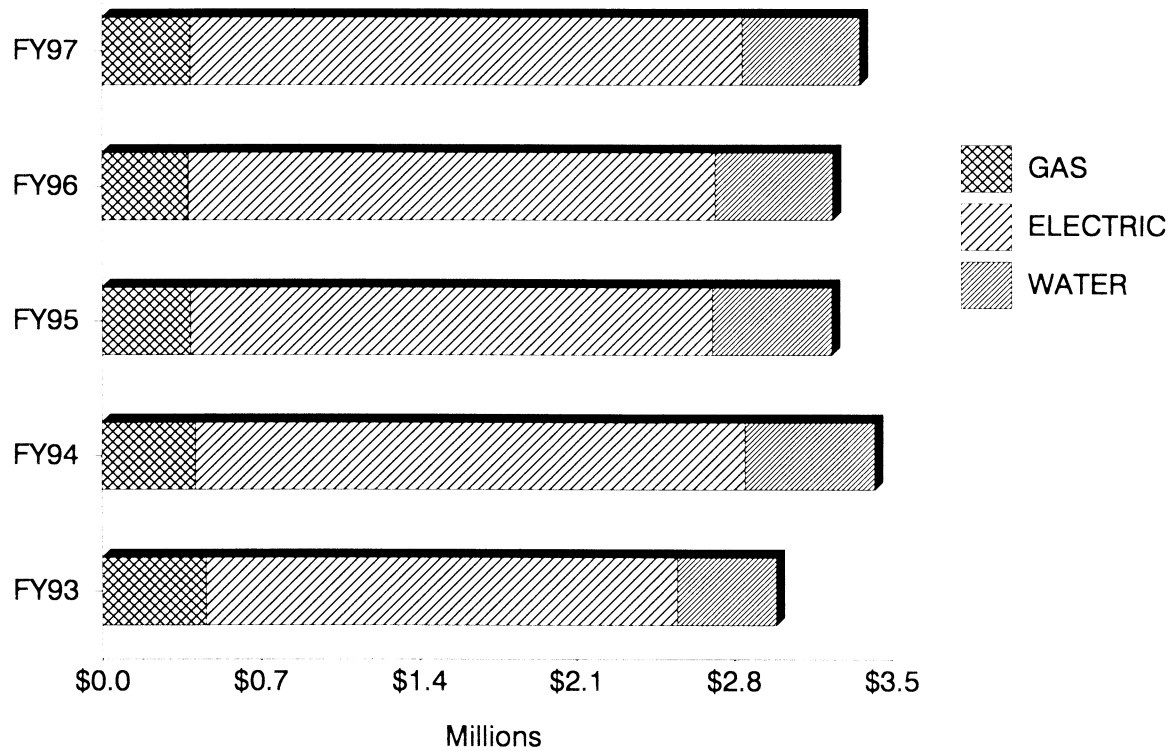

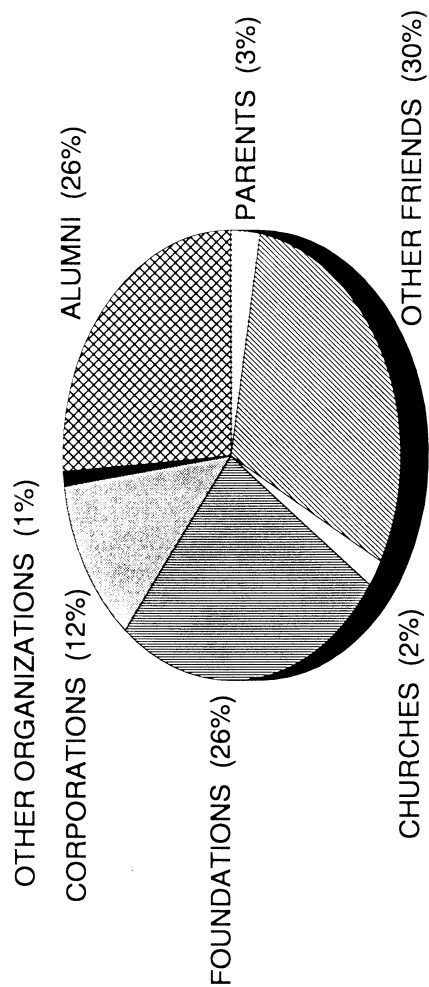

## **D**efinitions, F.T.E. Formulas

## DEFINITIONS

### **Credit Hours - Twelfth Class Day**

The twelfth day of class. For Fall 1997, this day was September 10, 1997.

### **Eligible for Tenure**

Full time faculty members who are in permanent, tenure-track positions on the TCU Budget.

### **Fiscal Year**

The fiscal year begins June 1 and ends May 31. Resource data are reported by fiscal year.

### **F.T.E. Formulas - See next page.**

### **Full-Time Equivalent**

The number obtained when part-time students, faculty, or staff are converted to full-time using a variety of formulas. See next page.

### **Instructional Faculty**

Faculty members who devote at least 50% of their time to classroom instruction.

### **Nonacademic Support Personnel**

Full-time and part-time personnel at TCU who carry job codes in the 1000, 3000, 4000, 5000, 6000 and 7000 series (Administrative, Professional, Technical, Clerical and Service personnel).

### **Official Headcount Enrollment**

Student enrollment becomes official on the twelfth class day.

### **TCU Corporation**

Consists of the AddRan College of Arts and Sciences, the M.J. Neeley School of Business, the School of Education, the College of Fine Arts and Communication, University Programs, Graduate Studies, and Harris College of Nursing. The inclusion of Harris College in the TCU Corporation became effective June 1, 1985.

### **Terminal Degree**

Includes all doctoral degrees and some master's degrees where the master's is the terminal degree for the position.

### **University Total**

Combines total figures for the TCU Corporation and Brite Divinity School.

## F.T.E. FORMULAS

### F.T.E. Student

Total undergraduate credit hours divided by 15 (full-time load for undergraduate students) plus total graduate hours divided by 9 (full-time load for graduate students). These two numbers added together result in the F.T.E. student count. This method has been used since Fall 1986.

### F.T.E. Staff

Part-time staff are converted to a full-time equivalent by dividing the number of hours worked annually by 2,080. For example, a staff member who works 20 hours a week for 52 weeks a year works 1,040 hours divided by 2,080 equals .50 F.T.E. A staff member who works 40 hours a week for 9 months a year works 1,560 hours divided by 2,080 equals .75 F.T.E.

### F.T.E. Faculty

F.T.E.'s for part-time faculty are computed as follows: 12 hours equals 1.00 except in Physical Education (7 hours equals 1.00) and Performance Music where 20 hours equals 1.00.

### Full-Time Equivalent Student to Faculty Ratio

Credit Hours taken from the Credit Hour Report as of the twelfth class day. F.T.E. faculty taken from the F.T.E. Instructional Faculty Report, F.T.E. Student formula taken from the IPEDS method of calculation.
